Prerona Pratibandhi Sishu Bikash Kendra is a non government, non profit voluntary organization working for under privileged group of children, specially abled children



and persons with special needs, established in Jorhat, Assam in the year 1992. It has been registered under Societies Registration Act 1860, Person with Disability Act 1995 and National Trust Act 1999. In the areas of upper Assam, Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh, it is the only R.C.I. recognized organization. The organization has received Income Tax exemption under section 12A, 80(G)of Income Tax Act 1961. It has also received registration under

Foreign Contribution Registration Act. It has been approved as **State Nodal Agency Centre under National Trust (Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment)** for the State of Assam and Arunachal Pradesh. Since its inception, it has been wholeheartedly and relentlessly catering the needs of the children and persons with disability.

Due to Covid pandemic situation, usual works of the institution with children was restricted even though every effort has been made to execute different activities in different location in addition to regular classroom/ organization activities.

Details activities of our organization for the period from April 2020 to March 2021 are as follows:

Early intervention and school readiness programme:

Early intervention and school readiness scheme for children in the age group of 0-10 years with four type of disabilities covered under National Trust being executed. The services focused on prevention and early intervention of these children to foster overall development. The child



receives individualized intervention consisting physiotherapy, speech & language therapy, child counseling etc. From the month of 1St December to April 13th, provided all the services in regular basis. But during Covid pandemic situation from May, the institute extended its services through home visit ,online classes and tele-counseling through its trained teaching official.

 Total 20 students have been benefited and out of 20 ,six students were admitted in Special School / SSA school as they have crossed their prescribed age limit as per scheme. 5 (five) students has been newly admitted in this scheme during the year.



centre for Special Education: In special school of the organization, there are several students having severe and moderate disabilities studying which includes ID, CP, Autism, multiple disability, Hearing shortage etc. Special educators trained them with Physiotherapy, Counseling, Yogas. Around 96 students were in study in the organization. Classes of the institute used to open in the month of April but due to the pandemic Covid 19 from May 2020, classes were completely closed from 14th April to 10th August 2020. From 11th August, the school was reopened and started with 1:1 ratio initially with 1 hour session which was gradually increased to 1:6 by maintaining all covid protocol and shifted the classroom to older building where social distancing could be maintained.

Activities:

Sanitization carried out in the premises. Before entry and starting the classes, temperature of everybody tested, hand sanitized and whole body of students and teachers, staff sanitized and PwDs were escorted. Maintained Social distancing and other SOP as instructed by GOA.

Respite Care Centre (SAMARTH)

It provides residential services for both short term and long term care for the persons with Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Intellectual Disability & Multiple Disability and are encouraged to extend support to adults and children. The centre is being visited by Doctors, Physiotherapists, Speech Therapists and Psychologists at regular intervals. The Respite Service Centre offers its residents a comfortable, secure and caring environment.

The organization temporarily closed down this centre from 16th March 2020 to Oct 2020 due Covid 19. However, services with limited staff were extended for orphan children by maintaining covid protocol. Beside due repeated request and pressure from parents, the centre again started from 15th November. Sanitization of entire premises and belongings were carried out before entering the RCC. Residents have refreshed with their day to day activities and regular yoga therapy. They were engaged in sport and cultural activities. 3 of them participated at Divya Kala Shakti-Witnessing Ability in Disability a cultural event presented by the Department of Empowerment of person with Disability (Divyanjan)(DEPWD) Government of India Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh on 04th March 2021. 2 resident participated in Third State Divyanjan Sports Meet, on 18th and 19th February, 2021 held at Sausajai Sports Complex, Guwahati and secured prizes. World Disability Day observed on 3rd Dec 2020.

District Disability Rehabilitation Centre -

Under DDRC projects, the school served the PwDs through various services. During the pendemic of Covid, provided various services like distribution of aids and appliances, referral for Legal guardianship certificate, Niramaya insurance facility, and UDID for CwSNs have extended. Moreover Disability Certificate and other information related with PwDs have disseminated. Details of services provided during the period were:

CHILD-LINE-1098

CHILDLINE is a 24 hours free phone emergence outreach service for children in need of care and protection. CHILDLINE responds to emergence need of children and also links them to long-term services. The CHILDLINE number 1098 is a toll free number and common in all cities of India. CHILDLINE Jorhat covers the entire Jorhat district and nearest districts like Sivsagar, Golaghat, Dhemaji ,Lakhimpur and Majuli etc





Overview of CHILDLINE - JORHAT activity

CHILDLINE JORHAT has played a very remarkable role in every aspect, where it responds to every child who dials 1098 and provides emergency assistance through intervention and long-term follow up.

Operational Strategy:

The Collaborative Organizations respond to all incoming calls, 24 hours a day and provide necessary assistance. The Collaborative Organization also responds when a concerned adult informs about a child in need of care and protection.

The primary role of the CHILDLINE Nodal Organization is to ensure effective networking and training of organizations associated with CHILDLINE. The nodal organization ensures that the issues faced in responding to calls are addressed for effective functioning of the service.

CHILDLINE Case Intervention: - CHILDLINE JORHAT intervenes to all call came in 1098 which comprises of providing medical assistance, counselling, linking children to shelter, restoring children to home, tracking missing children, intervening with children who has been physically or sexually abused, and other interventions related to violation of child rights.

Challenges:

- Facing problem for intervention in various cases due to the pandemic situation of COVID-19
- Due to the pandemic situation of COVID-19 the CHILDLINE team unable to conduct open house program & awareness program in schools especially from the month of April to May 2020.

Lack of coordination with DCPU of other districts.

In the training ,the Coordinator explained about MPR, MIS, and weekly reports of CHILDLINE. There was a discussion about case ID, case sheet, child statement etc and how to counsel a child or a client. Thereafter, all the CHILDLINE collab staff including its Director & Sub-Centre team members were demonstrated few activities related to child care and their protection.
- 10. Pochan month activity: On September 2020 Jorhat CHILDLINE organized a programme at Sadar Bagan, Jorhat regarding Pochan month. The CHILDLINE team measured highT & weight of the children of that area and discussed with them about discussion about healthy food one should eat.
- 11. CHILDLINE se Dosti Campaign (CSD): CHILDLINE se Dosti Campaign (CSD) 2020 was held from 14th to 20th November 2020 with tieing of bands to police officials and conducted awareness programme in various areas of the SISH District, regarding CHILDLINE 1098.

SNAC:

Prerona being a State Nodal Agency Centre (SNAC) of Assam, It has always tried to liaison with different NT registered organization, private NGO ,Non Govt. agencies etc to create awareness among public, parents of persons with disabilities, Govt. officials etc highlighting National Trust Act 1999, besides different schemes and activities of National Trust. For that purpose, SNAC, Assam has organized various meetings, awareness programmes and training programmes in various districts of Assam since its inception. But during the reporting year, it has restricted its activities due to COVID 19. Registered Organization's Meet as well as LLC meeting could not be held as expected.

Activities :


UDID registration: During The period we have online applied a total nos of 110 PwD students of our organization and 40 nos of DDRC beneficiaries for UDID registration. For the purpose few home visit made and collected Signature /thumb impression and other necessary documents of PwDs.

Legal guardianship:

Under SNAC, Assam, a total number of 18 applications of Legal Guardianship were submitted. On scrutiny of those applications, DC will approve some and will send those application to NT. Home visit were arranged for beneficiaries, and legal guardianship for awareness and collected necessary information like-Form C&D for LLC (guardianship).

DISHA centre: Under SNAC, all over Assam, except the two organization namely Sahayika Sishu Nirdeshan Kendra and Mrinaljyoti rehabilitation centre have been working. Total number of 66 students are benefited from those scheme. During this period, they have received grant from National Trust under Ministry of Social justice and Empowerment.

Registered organization meeting: Due to the pandemic condition of COVID 19,the SNAC, Assam has arranged two webinar meeting for NT's register organization of Assam, Manipur and Tripura on 16th June 2020 and 16th February 2021 respectively where National Trust's officers, State Govt. Officials, SNAC of Assam, Manipur and Tripura and other RO have participated.



Apart from that, The institute also arranged to provide 270 nos of food packages to the people who were in need particularly, to the daily wage earners at Baghchung block and Jorhat block in Jorhat district. A programme on proper technique of handwashing was also demonstrated to the people. Moreover mask and senitizer have been distributed more than 100 beneficiaries.


