On the basis of community based rehabilitation programme, we are also looking for much national and international organization to provide and support the research programme to come with the policy and programme interventions to minimize disability and promote the ability in their disability.

With the collaboration of many organizations, we have worked tremendously with the regular intervention and rehabilitation camp at the door steps. We regularly organize health camps in the rural areas as well as the urban areas. Currently we have collaboration with Bihar-Jharkhand Association of North America (BJANA), New Jersey, USA; Bihar-Jharkhand Medical Association, Manchester, United Kingdom. BJANA- Pravasi Alumni Nisshulk (PRAN) Clinic, USA.

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ABOUT THE ORGANISATION

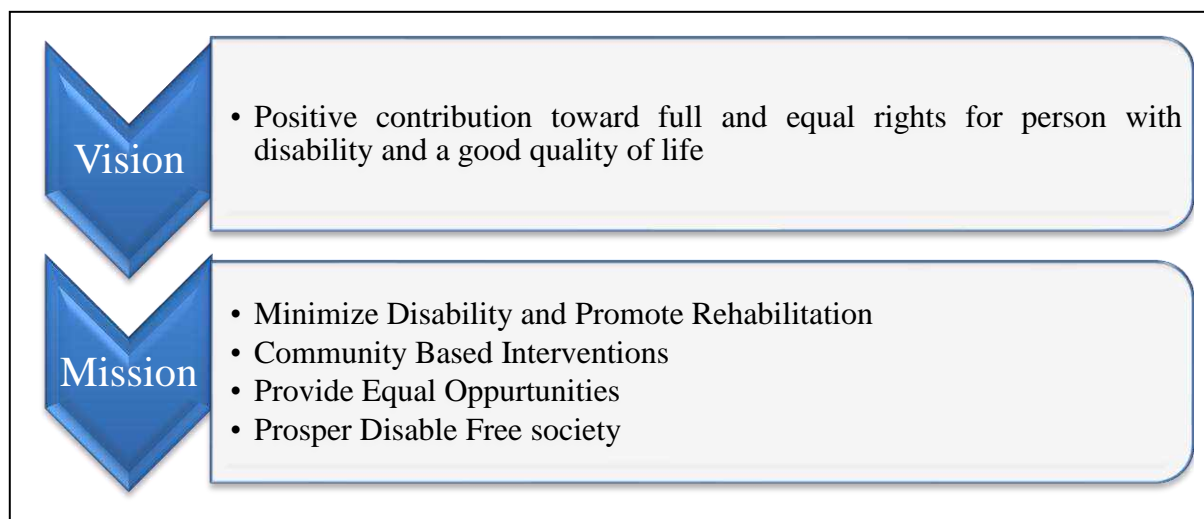
Aastha Charitable & Welfare Society (ACWS) is a not-for-profit organization established in 2011, registered under 'The National Trust Act, 1999' working for the people who are suffering from Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation & Multiple Disability. ACWS is one of the Bihar's largest multi-specialty Centre for Rehabilitation affiliated to the Ministry of social justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India.

Aastha is working for the rehabilitation of the disabled person, disabled children and the geriatric people and manufacturing of artificial limb and orthotics materials. Using the latest technology in instrument and technique, Aastha offers international standards of clinical competence and research. Aastha is running the physiotherapy clinic and occupational therapy, speech therapy for disabled children to skilling the differently abled children. The society adopted the 33 disabled children for rehabilitation and treatment till the date.

Aastha also provides free transport to pick-up and drop for BPL patients irrespective of the distance. Time to time the organisation distributes the orthotic and prosthetic material like artificial limb, caliper's, shoes, caliper's, wheel chair, tricycle and any assisting appliances according to the need of disabled totally free of cost.

COVID PANDEMIC AND AASTHA INITIATIVES

Covid Kit Distribution

With the outbreak of COVID pandemic across the country, AASTHA come forward and joined hand with the public and government to find the pandemic and save the life. In the series, the COVID safety kits distribution in month of April 2020 is well recognised. On the 8th April 2020 for the prevention of the COVID 19; AASTHA distributed Sanitizer, Gloves, Mask and Soaps the Patna Police, Patna Traffic Police, Patna Nigar Nigam staffs including Vegetable Vendors and the residents of nearby slum areas. The distribution took place mainly in Bailey Road at a stretch of 10-15 kilometers from Dakbangla Road Chowk to Gola Road.

UNCOOKED FOOD AND RATION DISTRIBUTION

Distribution of uncooked food- mission 15 days for 1500 families

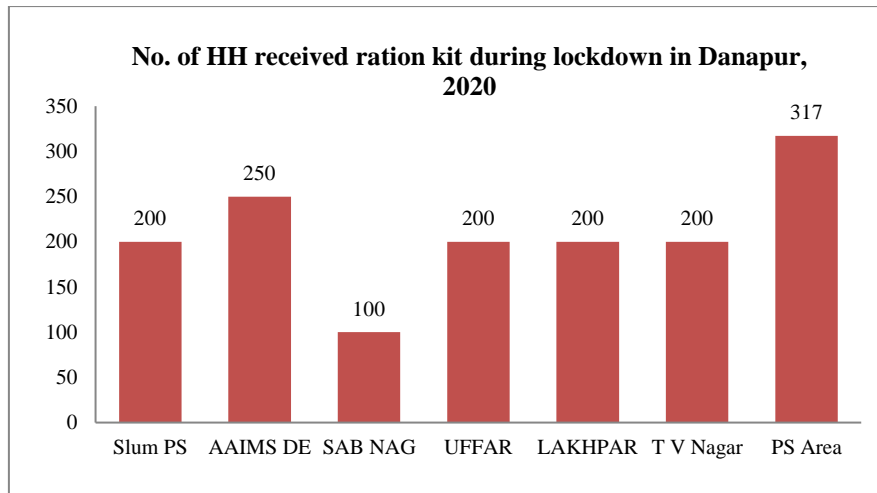
As India is still ranking high on the Global Hunger Index, 94 out of 107 countries globally, the initiative was profoundly revamped the motive to provide food to all. The raised concern in the pretext was the daunting situation amid nationwide lockdown in March-May 2020 due to COVID-19 pandemic. The life had come at halt for marginalised and vulnerable people including informal worker, daily wage workers and those living in slum localities along the scattered settlements on the periphery of the urban areas.

Uncooked Food Distribution by *Aastha*, Patna and BJANA, USA



As many had lost their daily earnings and are poor were at the verge of running empty stomach, AASTHA come forward to provide them uncooked ration for 1500 hundred families within the 15 days between 22 May, 2020 and 18 June, 2020. For this cause, BJANA, USA supported AASTHA and worked jointly during those periods.

Note: PS- Patliputra station, SAB NAG- Sabri Nagar, TV- Teslal Verma

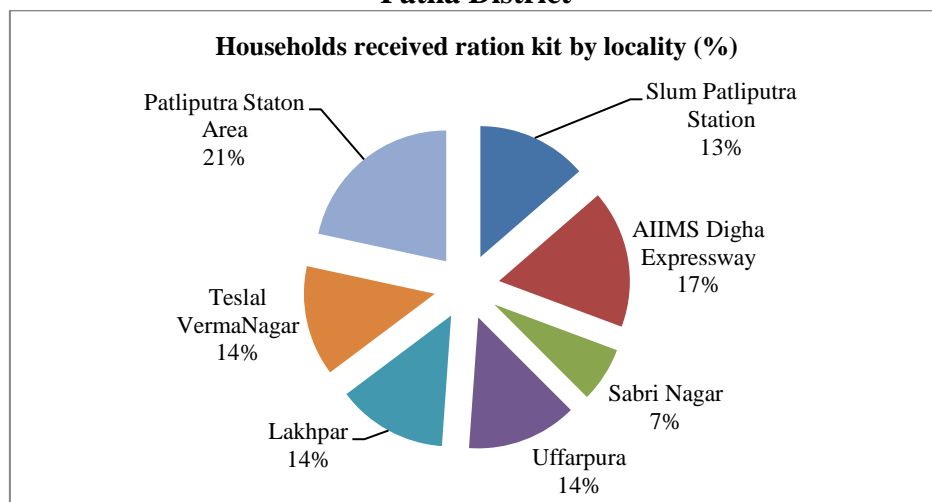
Monitoring and Supervision of Ration distribution by AASTHA Team



The ration was provided for one month to each of the families under this initiative across the *mohalla* and slum areas in Patna town.

- At the 1st day uncooked food distribution at Sabri Nagar, Khaleelpura Slum area Patna.
- 2nd Day Uncooked food distribution at Sabazpura, Khaleelpura Slum area Patna has been completed to the 150 needy families.
- 4th Day Uncooked food distribution at Khagaul, near kaali mandir, besides nahar (Slum area) of Patna has been completed to the 200 needy families.
- 5th Day Uncooked food distribution at the slum area of Teshlal Verma nagar near the Patliputra Railway Station, Patna (Bihar) has been completed to the 300 needy families.
- 6th day ration distributed in the slums near Patliputra Railway Station, Patna has been completed to the 250 needy families.

In July 2020, The Aashta Charitable and Welfare Society with support from the Bihar Jharkhand Medical Association, UK distributed uncooked food (Ration) to 250 needy families in the slum areas along the AIIMS Digha Express Way, Patna (Bihar). This initiative of distributing ration was held under “*Ab Bhukha Na Soyega Patna*” the provoked need of the poor families living in the slum areas at the margin of the life.



CHANGING LIVES

This Changing Lives initiatives of ACWS is focused on the holistic development of under privileged people especially children living in slums, nearby slums, streets, on the pavements in Patna urban areas. In the changing lives, ACWS regularly focus on those children well-being including their education and health needs. For their education ACWS always plays active roles for their education until they don't go to school. In the series, Aastha organised Health camp in Rupaspur and slums at Khagaul, Patna. More than 60 children got proper health & fitness checkups those lives in street and slum area.

COVID-19 Update and Awareness Sessions

With the rapid spreading Covid-19 pandemic across the globe, the bilateral cooperation and commitment to fight it jointly and save the life of people, AASTHA in collaboration with BJANA, USA initiated the live question-answer session pertaining to COVID-19 and related issues during first week of May, 2020. During the session team of doctors, non-governmental organisation and non-resident Indian especially who are settled in America come forward to spread the awareness and share the information and updates about this emerged pandemic and discussed in details about the prevention measures. During these sessions, AASTHA chairman including others informed the people about the ongoing relief works in different districts of Patna, Sitamarhi, Jehanabad, Ranchi and Jamshedpur etc.

Seminar on Role of Civil Society and Non-Governmental Organisations during COVID-19

Aastha Charitable and Welfare Society in collaboration with National trust organised a seminar on role of national trust organisations during COVID pandemic on 16 May 2020 which lasted over 2 hours. The chief guests of this program were Dr. Shivaji Kumar,

State Disability Commissioner, Government of Bihar, and U K Shukla, Program Director, National Trust, Government of India, and Anand Kumar, Director of Super 30 as the special guest participated in the seminar. In this program, about 200 participants including the registered organization, Divyangs, their family members and members of the national trusts were present and contributed actively.

Chief Guest mentioned that Bihar government is doing fabulous job during the time and pandemics and with the coordination with various departments completing the work related to the disabled. Program Director U K Shukla talked about the cooperation for the Divyang in this hour of in recovering from this disaster. Anand Kumar discussed the need for the holistic development of the Divyang. He added that work for Divyang is a great service, and talked about his cooperation in future also. Dr. Uma Shankar Sinha, who was presiding over the program which lasted for about 2 hours, said that in this hour of disaster, we all should try our level best to help the Divyangs.

Through this changing lives initiative of the ACWS, those children received proper healthcare and fitness. They started to go to school. This has also been done through the Rehabilitation and primary education children has started going to school.

SUCCESS STORY OF AASTHA REHABILITATION PROGRAMME

Roushan Kumar having Mental Retardation

Roushan Kumar is 6.5 years old boy, born on 31st August 2011. His father's name is Manish Kumar working as a carpenter and mother is house wife. They are staying at Shiv colony, Raja bazar near mother's academy, Patna. Their family income is approx. 6200 Rs per month. Roushan born with normal delivery at hospital, but gradually his father noticed that he is not behaving like the other children. Roushan was not able to understand the command, sit, speaks and eye to eye contact. When he became 2 years old they consulted with neuropsychiatric, physician and other doctors for the treatment, they diagnosed him Mental Retardation. After one year of the treatment, he doesn't recover then he visited at Aastha rehabilitation centre for the treatment.



Aastha did the proper assessment and made the plan of treatment like physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and special education etc. Now within 2 years of therapy Roushan has improved as much he can understand the command, communicate with any one, eye contact, behavioural problem and can walk with the support.

*Roushan parents expressed heartily thanks to Aastha for the continuous treatment on free of cost. He is in **Disha Cum Vikaas Scheme** of the National Trust Now he is going school happily.*

Prachi Priyam with Hydrocephalus

Prachi Priyam born on 11th September 2009 is a 9 years old girl whose father's name is Sanjay Kumar Gupta. He lives at Salimpur Ahra, Kadamkuan , Patna and he is a business man has a own book shop. He born with full time normal delivery but his head was large as compare to normal child. He has diagnosed hydrocephalus with spina bifida. It's a congenital disease his all four limbs have developed contracture. His father consulted with neurosurgeon, neurosurgeon recommended surgery of the spina bifida but only 10% chance of recovery and lots of money is required for the surgery. Her parents were not able to effort that amount of money then he started the homeopathic treatment due to money problem.



Any how their parents came to know about the Aastha rehabilitation centre and visited there for the treatment. Our physiotherapist started treatment and releases the contracture of muscle and started the ADL training. After 15 months of treatment, she is able to sit on the wheel chair and can do her activity of daily living with very minimal support and she can stand with the minimal support. Aastha is the ray of hope for their family. She is in the **Disha Cum Vikaas Scheme** of the National Trust

Kiran kumari with Disability

Kiran kumari is two years old baby, staying at Dhanaut, Rupaspur, Patna with parent in small hut. Her mother is house wife and father is auto driver. Their family income is very less near about 5000 Rs per month. She has born in the government hospital with normal delivery. When she was one year old she doesn't walk, talk, interact with family members, even she doesn't identify her parents. One day our community mobilizer visited in the community for the survey of disabled children after that one community member informed us about the Kiran Kumari and her disability, our team visited at her home and talked with mother. At first, she was denying about her baby and her problem but after introduction of our team she accepted her problem and finally convinced to come at our centre for the service. We provided the all treatment free of cost.



After counselling of her parent, she is coming at ASTHA rehabilitation centre for the therapy and special education. Within one year of therapy her motor function has improved so that she can stand independently and walk with minimal support. She starts communication with her parent with gesture and simple words like papa, mama etc. To see the recovery of kiran her parent is very glad and acceptance of disabled child in the community has been increased. Really ASTHA is the blessing for the underprivileged children with disability. She is in the **Disha Cum Vikaas Scheme** of the National Trust

PATNA: The 'divyang' children recognized from national disability were provided smartphones on Sunday at an event organized on the occasion of World Disability Day here in the state capital on Sunday. (The smartphones would help them to attend virtual classes.

State Commissioner of Disability Dr Shishu Kumar as chief guest and Dr Ranjit Kumar, Director of World Disability Day organized by Aashu Charitable and Welfare Society (SNAU, Bihar, National Trust, Department of Disability, Empowerment, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India), appreciated the works of Aashu Charitable and Welfare Society.

Dr Shishu Kumar said that the state government is working with disabilities.

Therefore, many state-level programmes are also being run for them. He said that those people also come from our society, so we also need to work hard for them.

Director of Education Department, Dr Ranjit Kumar said that the way the work is being done for the differently abled people in Bihar in such a situation, we will wish that the disability will change to efficiency. He said that the work which we people spend a lot of time in learning. Divyang people do the same in a very short time. In fact, God has given them divine parts. Nevertheless, all of us should work for them by taking out 3-4 days in a month.

At the same time, Dr Umeshankar Sinha, Secretary of the Coordinator National Trust, demanded the government to arrange rehabilitation for the disabled on the lines of AIMS in Bihar. He said that it is sad that there is no rehabilitation system for the disabled in Bihar. It is very important for them to have a system of rehabilitation. The government needs to work in this direction, he added.
