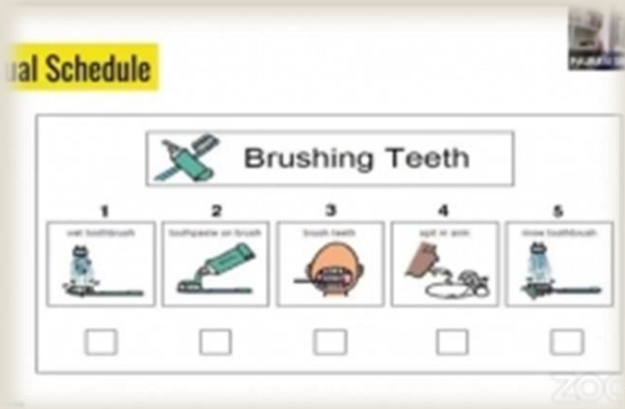

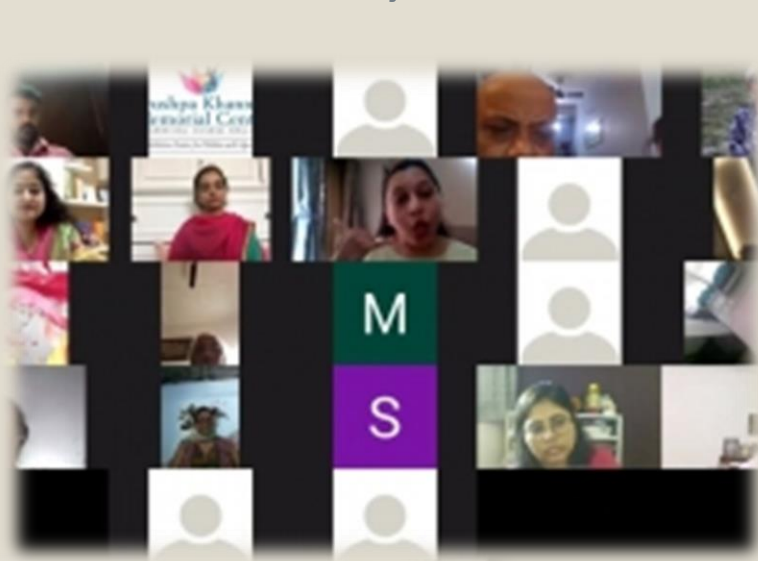

2. Include activities that Child enjoys

4. Teach communication skills

- Wait for child's response
- Avoid asking many questions
- Speak in fewer words
- Speak Slowly
- Give one command at a time
- Use gestures or visuals to make them understand better
- Give them time to process
