


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JJS AT A GLANCE

PROMOTING ECONOMIC SELF RELIANCE AMONG THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED

JAN SHIKSHAN SANSTHAN (JSS)

Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) was established to provide vocational training to non-literate, neo-literate as well as school dropouts by identifying skills as would have a market in the region of their establishment. The JSS which was under the Ministry of HRD has now been transferred to Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) with effect from 01.04.2018.

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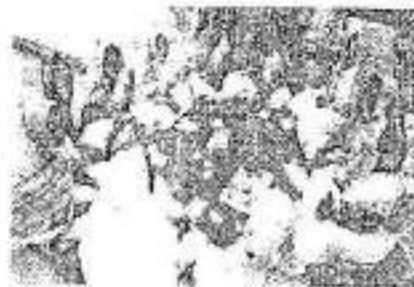


During the year 800 nos. of beneficiaries have been trained in above trades with support for their gainful employment. Most of the beneficiaries are young women hailing from rural BPL families within the age group of (15-35) years. The said project has been a crucial link between the semi and neo literates hailing from rural areas with no proper source of income. This project has created a platform for their economic self reliance and social empowerment.


PROMOTION OF SHG & MED THROUGH NABARD

Self-Help Group as the name implies is a group of (10 to 20) individuals who have formed a non formal organization in order to extend mutual help to address their socioeconomic issues. In a self-help group, the members share a common problem, often a common disease or addiction. Their mutual goal is to help each other to deal with, if possible to heal or to recover from, this problem. In traditional society, family and friends provided social support. In modern industrial society, however, family and community ties are often disrupted due to mobility and other social changes. Thus, people often choose to join with others who share mutual interests and concerns. SHG movement in India has been a success and through this initiative lakhs of women from economically weaker sections have been benefited.

During the year 130 nos. of SHGs were formed in Subarnapur district of Odisha under the NABARD Sponsored SHG Promotion & Linkage Programme. Till the end of the reporting year JJS has 350 nos. of active SHGs involving 3854 nos. of poor and ambitious ladies hailing from 214 villages of Puri & Subarnapur district.



Under the NABARD sponsored Programme the SHGs will be provided credit linkage for starting their own self employment units. Our organization will facilitate the process. All the members will have their own micro enterprise with micro credit from NABARD. All the members are regularly having thrift and credit program. JJS, during the year organized ten nos. of Capacity Building Programs for the SHG leaders for enhancing their capacity and leadership qualities. Two nos. of training programs for SHG members were organized in Micro

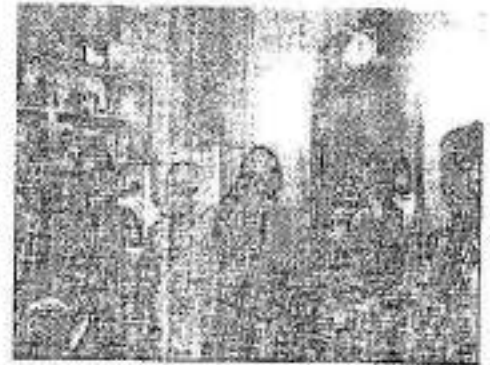


Enterprise Development and EDP at Ullunda under the reporting year. Efforts are on for convergence of welfare schemes of Govt. to further enhance their earning potential and quality of living.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING

Despite the emphatic stress laid on education and training in our country, there is still a shortage of skilled manpower to address the mounting needs and demands of the economy. As an immediate necessity that has urgently arisen from the current scenario, the government is dedicatedly striving to initiate and achieve formal/informal skill development of the working population via education/vocational education/skill training and other upcoming learning methods.

The skill development of the working population is priority for the government. This is evident by the exceptional progress India has witnessed under the National Policy on Skills (2009) over the years. In order to address the problem of unemployment and related social/economic issues of tribal youths, Govt. has been sponsoring a no. of schemes adopting different measures but the ultimate goal enhancing the economic status of poor tribals, by achieving economic self sufficiency is still a distant dream.



With a view to solve this critical issues, JJS has been managing a no. of activities like Tailoring, Rixin Bag making, Food Processing, Mobile Repairing, Agarbati making etc, at Sonepur under Subarnapur district of Odisha. Through these activities the unemployed youths from tribal communities including some of PTGs are being provided skill training and back up assistance for their gainful employment. 180 nos. of unemployed youths especially ladies were trained during the year in various trades as above and then engaged in the production center managed by the organization to gain such practical knowledge and some seed money for starting their own production units.

PROMOTING EFFORTS FOR REDUCING DRUG ABUSE:

INTEGRATED REHABILITATION CENTER FOR ADDICTS:

There are several reasons why drug usage soon gets changed drug abuse. At a very basic level this happens because the person concerned feels a desperate need to deal with stress, to get a momentary high or to just 'fit in' with his or her peers, as happens in the case of youngsters. It soon reaches a stage where this need becomes much more than other needs in life and the person begins to believe their survival depends on those drugs.

To control the drug abuse and trafficking the Govt. of India has framed some laws and time & again adopting various other measures.



JJS has also been lending its helping hand by running a 10 Bedded Integrated Rehabilitation Center for Addicts (IRCA) at Paralakhemundi under Gajapati district of Odisha since last four years to control drug abuse and related social issues. Since long our organization has been making sincere efforts to stop wide spread drug abuse and create general consciousness among the public through awareness programmes. The said center has been providing various services including awareness generation against drug abuse, identification of addicts, motivational counseling for treatment, in house and out house treatment of the addicts for detoxification, counseling and rehabilitation services, outreach services to deal with the clients living in unreachable areas of the district, after care services to the recovered clients for maintaining sobriety, re-integration of recovered addicts with the main stream of the society etc. During the year on report more than 145 nos. of addicts have been treated and most of them are now maintaining drug free sober living.

Drug users are regarded as highly vulnerable to HIV/AIDS and therefore the organization has been taking special care in educating the drug users regarding various preventive mechanism for spreading HIV/AIDS among the drug users. 10 nos. suspected cases had been referred by the IRCA during the year to the VCCTC for screening of HIV.

The said program has been useful in transforming the lives of hundreds of drug addicts by making them drug free & reintegrating them with the main stream of the society. Scores of such families have been saved of financial and social bankruptcy at the same time reducing the law & order problems and maintaining the social harmony.

ASSISTING DISADVANTAGED SECTIONS OF THE SOCIETY


i) HOME FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

The society has been recently witnessing rapid transformation in various fronts like social, economic and political and its resultant impact has affected the living conditions of the people. The so-called traditional family system has been disintegrated into smaller nuclear families. The most of the younger generation preferring urban areas to rural areas due to the modern living conditions. As a result the aged members of the families are staying back at their place in rural areas uncared.



However, the senior citizens, referred to as elders, face certain problems as a consequence of the social transformation. This is reflected in the transition from the traditional ways of life to modern patterns, which require many compromises and adjustments.

The present day scenario changed slowly and steadily with the decline or disappearance of the joint family system, which was replaced by the nuclear family system. Many reasons may be attributed for this change, which reflected not only the whole family set-up but also the life pattern of elders, who became dependent, partially or totally. The major factor was the disintegration of families, necessitated

coordination, flexibility and pain levels. Ultimately physiotherapy has been proven by research to help older adults to maintain their health, well-being, functional ability and independence.

Considering the positives of such treatment process our organization has been managing a Physiotherapy Clinic at Paralakhemundi under Gajapati district of Odisha since last three years with its own resources. During the year 86 no. of patients were treated free of cost. We are taking necessary steps for availing financial assistance from Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment for the said project.

(iv) SWADHAR GREH

One of the most common phenomenon of our society is discrimination towards women. The women have always been exploited lot serving the family members as the care taker. Such an attitude towards the women folks is against their basic rights as envisaged in our constitution. Government realizing problem has been taking requisite steps to address the issued relating to the women in difficulty.




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To take care of the women of our society living in difficulty Govt. of India, Ministry of Women & Child Development has been implementing the Scheme "Swadhar Greh". The said scheme envisions a supportive institutional framework for women victims of difficult circumstances so that they could lead their life with dignity and conviction. It envisages that shelter, food, clothing, and health as well as economic and social security are assured for such women. It also envisages that the special needs of these women are properly taken care of and under no circumstances they should be left unattended or abandoned which could lead to their exploitation and desolation.

Our organization has been implementing this project since 2007-08 with assistance from Govt. of India, Ministry of Women & Child Development. The project is now located at Ranipalli, Block- Birmaharajpur of Subarnapur district. The center is running & at present giving shelter to 30 nos. of such ladies living without social and economic support. They are being provided integrated services such as lodging, boarding, healthcare, clothing, recreational and legal & emotional counseling, legal assistance along with skill training for their complete rehabilitation.

Besides the women, their dependent children below 14 years of age are also provided shelter with their mothers with provision of all the services including education to make them responsible citizen in the future.

(v) CHILDREN'S HOME

In our society there are scores of children who live in problematic situations without proper care and protection. This is despite wholehearted efforts at all level to protect the rights of children in need, thereby exposing these children to exploitation. Hence these children needs to be picked and mainstreamed so that the safety of their future is ensured. Generally in our society biological parents and sometimes biological grandparents are legally responsible for supporting children, but in the absence of these, no named godparent, or other relatives willing to care for the children, they become a ward of the state, and Children's Home are one way of providing for their care, housing and education etc.



Our organization is managing a Children's Home at Sonepur with assistance from Women & Child Development Deptt., Govt. of Odisha. Under ICPS Scheme of Ministry of Women Child Development, Govt. of India. At present 38 nos. of children in need of care and protection are present in the Children's Home. The services being provided to them include shelter, nutritious food as per the prescribed menu, healthcare, education, recreational and vocational training for their all-round capacity building.


The children are enrolled in the local formal schools for their education and a tutor is engaged at Home to follow up them and solve their problems. Yoga is being practiced to promote physical well being and spirituality among the children. Also there is the provision of teaching song, art, music, dance in order to promote extracurricular activities and help to find out the hidden talent. Each year the children are being exposed to various competitions to groom their talents.

(vi) SPECIALIZED ADOPTION AGENCY (SAA)

Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA) is one of the constituent projects of the Scheme "Integrated Child Protection Scheme", Govt. of India, Ministry of Women & Child Development. SAA is meant for the placement of orphaned, abandoned or surrendered children for adoption in accordance the provisions of various guidelines for adoption issued from time time, by the State Government, or the Central Adoption Resource



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Authority (CARA) and notified by the Central Government. Juba Jyoti Jubak Sangha has been recognized by Govt. Of Odisha, Women & Child Development Deptt. as SAA for Subarnapur district with effect from 09.02.2017.



SAA is responsible for the care, protection and well-being of every child in its charge and shall cater to their health needs; emotional and psychological needs; educational and training needs; leisure and recreational activities; protection from any kind of abuse, neglect and exploitation; social mainstreaming and restoration or as the case may be and follow-up.

During the year 8 nos. of children have been admitted in the SAA out of which one child is parentless, four nos. are abandoned and three are surrendered children. During the year 3 nos. of children have been placed under adoption and the process is on for adoption of two children.

Our organization is taking necessary steps for sensitization of the community regarding adoption and various rules governing the adoption to promote adoption.

vii) SPECIAL SCHOOL FOR DISABLED

As we know the children with disability have some physical deformations which do not allow them to do normal works like others and they depend upon others to some extent for performing various tasks. In case of children it is very complicated as they need special caretaker and for education they face problems as they cannot study in the general schools as they need special teachers, aids and appliances, conducive environment etc. Therefore Government is taking steps for addressing this problem and Special School for disabled is one of the projects under DDRS Scheme. The main thrust of special education is to develop communication skills and other sensory abilities, with the end objective varying from acquiring daily living skills to integration in regular institutions of learning and society in general. Residential facilities is also extended to the beneficiaries under the project.

Our organization started such a school during the year 2015-16 at Joda under Keonjhar district of Odisha from its own resources. Fifty five nos. of disabled have been enrolled and provided with education along with integrated care & protection services.

(viii) COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION OF PwDs

Disability is an important public health problem especially in developing countries like India. The problem will increase in future because of increase in trend of non-communicable diseases and change in age structure with an increase in life expectancy. The issues are different in developed and developing countries, and rehabilitation measures should be targeted according the needs of the disabled with community participation. In India, a majority of the disabled resides in rural areas where accessibility, availability and utilization of rehabilitation services and its cost-effectiveness are the major issues to be considered.

There are scores of persons with disability living in our society particularly in rural areas who are unaware of various schemes and facilities available for their welfare. The Govt. machinery cannot reach to each of them and provide them all the facilities. Hence the NGOs working in the area are the link agencies who facilitate the process of welfare of persons with disability through the Govt. sponsored schemes.


Our organization is extending integrated care and support to the PwDs by implementing the Community Based Rehabilitation Project in Subarnapur district of Odisha. The major objective of **Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR)** is to ensure that people with disabilities are able to maximize their physical and mental abilities, have access to regular services and opportunities, and achieve full integration within their communities. During the year 120 nos. of disabled were benefited under the programme. They were provided rehabilitative services based on their individual requirement such as supply of aids & appliances, providing them pensions, vocational training, assisting in DRI Loan, Scholarship for the school & college students etc. Among them there are 30 nos. of Multiple Disable cases who were assisted as per their needs.

ix) OUTSOURCING OF DESIGNATED FUNCTIONS OF SSEPD DEPTT.



Department of Social Security & Empowerment of Persons with Disability, Govt. of Odisha has been responsible for implementing various welfare schemes for the target groups like senior citizens, PwDs, Drug Addicts, T.Gs, Beggars, Lepers, L.CPs, Destitute persons etc. But it was observed that due to unavailability of adequate personnel at field level the target for various social security schemes are not being achieved. Considering the above issue, Deptt decided to engage the NGOs on outsourcing basis to engage personnel at G.P level to facilitate the process of implementation of various schemes of the Deptt. of


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SSEPD.

Our organization has been approved by Govt. of Odisha, SSEPD Deptt. as one of the Service Providers for implementation of above work in four districts like **Boudh, Subarnapur, Jharsuguda & Deogarh on outsourcing basis.**

Our organization has engaged personnel at G.P. level in all the above 4 districts of Odisha since December'2017 to carry out all the activities of SSEPD Deptt. on outsourcing basis like survey, identification of PwDs and certification, need assessment, rehabilitation of PwDs, drug addicts, beggars, transgender, senior citizens and take steps for streamlining the distribution of pensions through Aadhar Seeding, deletion of dead and ineligible beneficiaries and updating of pensioners data base on the online portal. Thousands of PwDs including MD, MR, CP, Autism were identified, screened, empanelled for IGNDP, UDID, Scholarships for themselves and their children pursuing education, involved in PwD SHG, provided Aids & Appliances, Vocational Training and Self Employment Kit, Involvement in NREGA Programme for livelihood etc.

A View of the BBSA Camp at Tielibani block of Deogarh district of Odisha

The programme started in the Month of December'2017 and continuing. All the project districts have been covered. Implementation of the project has helped in successful implementation of various social security related schemes of SSEPD Deptt.



One of the most important activities is the BBSA Camp where all the desired services are provided to the PwDs at one place. Such camps were also organized in all the districts and the services provided are as follows.

ENSURING MINIMUM HEALTH & HYGIENE FOR RURAL MASS :

i) PROMOTION OF AYUSH METHOD OF TREATMENT

AYUSH is an acronym for Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homeopathy and are the six Indian systems of medicine prevalent and practiced in India and some of the neighboring Asian countries. It has been observed that AYUSH system of treatment is our own traditional system and followed since ages. Advancement of Allopathic system has completely changed the health scenario but there is still a sizable section of our population using these alternative systems of treatment which is found to be effective.

From various studies it was observed that Allopathic system of treatment may be fast and target specific and gives relief from diseases very early but at the same time it creates a lot of health issues due to the side effects of various drugs used which are made up of chemicals. But in case of AYUSH it is not so as it uses medicines prepared from plants, hence has no side effect.

Considering the above issue our organization decided to undertake a project involving AYUSH system of treatment and adopted one G.P of Sonepur block of Subarnapur district for the purpose. During the year 1140 nos. of patients were provided with treatment for various diseases like Respiratory Tract Infection, Skin diseases, diseases relating to digestive system etc. free of cost. The intervention was successful as it helped the targeted patients in recovery from various ailments without any side effects. We are in the process of availing assistance from Govt. of India for the purpose.

ii) WATER & SANITATION PROGRAMME


Water & Sanitation play the most important role in ensuring the health status of a particular community. These are the basic issues which affect the health scenario and needs to be addressed properly. In urban areas these issues are generally taken care of by the Govt. Considering the importance of sanitation Govt. of India had been implementing the Swachha Bharat Mission which promotes construction of IHHL in the house of every individual.

Our organization was involved in construction of IHHL in Subarnapur & Boudh districts of Odisha with assistance from RWS & S. After construction of IHHL necessary sensitization programmes were organized to advocate the proper and regular use of latrines for maintaining the good health status of the community.

(iii) PROMOTION OF YOGA :

Yoga is a systematic practice of physical exercise, breath control, relaxation, diet control, and positive thinking and meditation aimed at developing harmony in the body, mind, and environment. The practice entails low-impact physical activity, postures (called asanas), breathing techniques (pranayama), relaxation, and meditation. Most people are familiar with the physical poses or yoga positions but don't know that yoga involves so much more.

Our organization organized 10 nos. of yoga camps in high schools in Subarnapur district of Odisha in order to improve concentration, memory and physical well being of the students which are

important for them to improve in career. We are taking initiative to train the teachers in schools so that they can promote yoga in the schools among the children.

iv) DIABETIC AWARENESS CAMP

Diabetes is a chronic, incurable disease that occurs when the body doesn't produce any or enough insulin, leading to an excess of sugar in the blood. Insulin is a hormone, produced by the pancreas, which helps the cells of the body use the glucose (sugar) in food.

Out of the 32 million people living with diabetes in India it is estimated that at least half of them go un-diagnosed and are unaware of the disease, its prevention and potential complications.

Over the past two decades we have found an alarming increase in diabetes among all sections of people of the society. In order to address this problem, we came upon the idea of starting diabetes awareness camps on regular basis.

Through a variety of awareness activities and training programmes we target to address the problems of people suffering from Diabetes and reduce the chronic health issues associated with the disease.

During the year 8 nos. of such programmes were organized in Subarnapur district of Odisha and thousands of people were educated about Diabetes and its possible prevention measures.

AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON BLOOD DONATION

Blood saves life and is very valuable. Hence efforts are being made at all level to collect blood from voluntary donors and store it in proper way to be used for patients during emergency. Blood donation is an extremely noble act. Our organization is taking initiative to organize voluntary blood donation camp since last two years. Also we are taking necessary steps for creating awareness about blood donation as quantity of blood donated is refilled very fast in the body and does not create any issue for the donor.

It is a good message that needs to be spread across the world. One's blood could come in use for someone in real need of it, someone who has had an operation or an injury. Every drop really counts and one should make it a point to donate blood, at least once a year. The eligible age for donating blood is 18 years, and one should try and put their effort towards this noble cause and help people

Our organization organized 4 nos. of awareness programmes in Jharsuguda district to educate the people about this noble work. Due to our effort hundreds of volunteers donated the blood through Red Cross.

PROMOTION OF SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

Sustainable agriculture in many ways, but ultimately it seeks to sustain farmers, resources and communities by promoting farming practices and methods that are profitable, environmentally sound



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and good for community. This form of agriculture enables us to produce healthful food without compromising future generations' ability to do the same.

The state of Odisha has agrarian economy where around 70% of total population depend upon agriculture for their livelihood. Therefore Juba Jyoti Jubak Sangha is giving special emphasis to promote sustainable agriculture in its area of operation like the districts of Kalahandi, Sonepur, Boudh and Gajapati. As it strongly endorses the practice of lab-to-land in agriculture, it has been a part of Government's initiative in **technology dissemination, participatory planning, value addition, demonstrative farming and marketing of produces**. Apart from it, it has put effort in empowerment of farming community and capacity building of farmers.

In its operational areas, JJJS is promoting organic farming which is a holistic production management system based on basic principle of minimizing the use of external inputs and avoiding the use of synthetic fertilizers and pesticides to ensure sustainability of agriculture. Activities in this effort include:

- Awareness generation among farmers on the benefits of organic farming
- Imparting training to farmers on vermi-compost and other solid and liquid manures
- Demonstration of organic farming

The organization has worked for safeguarding the traditional knowledge of agriculture, particularly of tribal communities, relating to organic farming, preservation and processing of food for nutritional and medicinal purposes. People have realized the advantages of organic agriculture. It has increased farm productivity substantially.

PROMOTING EDUCATION IN BACKWARD AREAS

EDUCATIONAL COMPLEX FOR SC/ST GIRLS


With a view to provide access to education to the girls belonging to the tribal community from inaccessible pockets of the state where the female literacy is very low, Govt. of India, Ministry of Tribal Affairs has been managing the scheme called : "Strengthening Education in Low Literacy Pockets". Our organization has been managing school called as Educational Complex at Kesinga of Kalahandi district since 2011-12 from its own resources. The districts has a very low rate of female literacy at 17%.

These institutions provide education based on school curriculum with a holistic approach for all-round capacity building of the girls in every respect like sports, culture, social work, physical well being, life skill etc, to make them capable enough to compete with others in the society and live a respectful living. In addition to this, the students are provided various vocational training to make them employment-ready whenever they complete their academic career.

SENSITIZING THE RURAL MASS ON KEY ISSUES:

CONSUMER AWARENESS PROGRAM

Consumer Awareness is an act of making sure the buyer or consumer is aware of the information about products, goods, services, and consumers rights. **Consumer awareness** is important so that buyer can take the right decision and make the right choice.

The understanding by an individual of their rights as a consumer concerning available products and services being marketed and sold. The concept involves four categories including safety, choice, information, and the right to be heard. Consumer awareness is a need of present days. Since we are inspired to buy different product through advertisement but many of them are not qualitative product. It has been observed very often that a consumer does not get right goods and services. He is charged a very high price or adulterated or low quality goods are sold to him. Therefore it is necessary to make him aware.



With a view to educate the consumers regarding their rights, JJS organized two meetings all the stateholders like volunteers, school teachers, school children, SHG members etc in Ullunda block of Subamapur district. Concerned Govt. officials and volunteers from the local NGOs were involved in the program. The resource persons educated the participants regarding consumer protection laws, its application and how to protect themselves from the greedy

businessmen. Leaflets were distributed highlighting the different consumer laws, consumer protection councils etc. among the participants who were requested to disseminate the knowledge in their respective areas to safeguard the common interest of the consumers.

ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS

Environment includes all living and non-living objects. We live in the environment and use the environmental resources like air, land and water to meet our needs. Development also means meeting the needs of the people. While meeting the ever-growing needs, we put pressure on the environment. When the pressure exceeds the carrying capacity the environment to repair or replace itself, it creates a serious problem of environmental degradation. If we use any environmental resource such as ground water beyond its limit of replacement, we may lose it forever. Therefore, there is a need to create 'awareness' about Environmental protection. While efforts are being made at the national and international level to protect our environment, it is also the responsibility of every citizen to use our environmental resources with care and protect them from degradation.

As an initiative to check the environmental degradation JJS during the year organized awareness programmes in Binika lock of Subarnapur district of Odisha involving various campaigns like meetings, FGD, Meetings, Rally, Debate Competition etc..

Also during the year on report a decentralized nursery was raised at B.M. Pur under Subarnapur district of Odisha in which 30,000 plant seedlings were raised and then distributed to the local inhabitants free of cost for planting in their own backyard. Such an initiative will help the people to meet their fuel wood and fodder demand to some extent in due course and help in reducing the load on natural forest resources.

HIV/AIDS AWARENESS PROGRAMME

HIV stands for Human Immunodeficiency Virus. It's a virus that breaks down certain cells in your immune system (your body's defense against diseases that helps you stay healthy). When HIV damages your immune system, it's easier to get really sick and even die from infections that your body could normally fight off.

Once you have HIV, the virus stays in your body for life. There's no cure for HIV, but medicines can help you stay healthy. HIV medicine lowers or even stops your chances of spreading the virus to other people. Studies show that using HIV treatment as directed can lower the amount of HIV in your blood so much that it might not even show up on a test.

The number of people living with HIV/AIDS in India is an alarming 2.4 million, according to a 2008 government-backed estimate.

Considering the veracity of the issue JJS decided to create awareness about the disease as prevention is better than cure and AIDS had no cure till date. To fulfill the objective during the reporting year we organized targeted intervention programmes for truckers which includes educative programmes such as meetings, debate competitions, posters etc. tried its best to create mass consciousness among the general public especially the vulnerable population against the incurable disease in Subarnapur district of Odisha.

PROMOTION OF CULTURE

Indian culture is unique in many senses which can be experienced if we move from one state to other. The language, religions events, songs, dance, costumes, living style, fooding habit, housing etc. change from one state to other. The *Indian culture*, often labeled as an amalgamation of several *cultures*, spans across the *Indian* subcontinent and has been influenced by a history that is several millennia old.

As we know Cultural Programmes play an important role in providing recreation thus help the human being to overcome the difficulties and hardships of the life and also binds the people of different caste, religion, group, community etc. with a thread of friendship & fraternity. It helps in strengthening the communal harmony and promoting national integration.

Realizing the importance of the cultural programmes our organization has been giving due emphasis to cultural activities since long. WELFARE OF CHILD/WOMEN LABOUR

Child labour is, generally speaking, work by children that harms them or exploits them in some way - physically, mentally, morally or by blocking their access to education.

To rehabilitate the child labour engaged in hazardous activities JJJS rescued child laborers from different professions and admitted in the child labour schools. In the said schools meant for their rehabilitation the child labours are receiving elementary education, vocational skill training. They are being provided free nutrition & healthcare services to keep themselves healthy and fit.

Also an educative programme was organized for women laborers at Kesinga under Kalahandi district in which the various welfare issues like labour laws, labour welfare initiatives, various welfare schemes were discussed and knowledge was disseminated to them.

PROMOTION OF OBCs AND MINORITIES

Notwithstanding various developmental initiatives, the status of OBC and Minorities has not improved and most of them are living below poverty line. Hence the Govt. is initiating scores of measures for improving their socio economic status so that social equity can be maintained.



Sixteen nos. of poor households with experience in the field of fishery were engaged to earn their livelihood. This initiative is being used as a center for extension of pisciculture in the area by providing training to the aspiring farmers.
