### ORGANISATION PROFILE

The Regd. No. is 3268-348/1992-93. Further, the organization has also been registered under foreign contribution (Regulation) Act. 1976 and the Registration no. is 105020252 of 2000-01. Organization has also registered under National Trust and PwD act. A mere 26 years since its inception PINGALAKHI PUBLIC WELFARE ORGANISATION has carved a niche for itself among the social institutions in Puri District of the state Odisha.

To excel as an able social organization for the benefit of the needy masses and to ensure them the quality of their life, PINGALAKHI PUBLIC WELFARE ORGANISATION is still in its effort for such reality through participatory action.

#### **ACTIVITIES TAKEN DURING THE YEAR**

The Organisation has taken number of welfare and innovative programmes and activities in the area of creating massive awareness at community level, education of the children with disabilities, skill based vocational training and empowerment of persons with disabilities with the support and cooperation of Stake-holders, Civil Society, various departments, Beneficiaries, Family members.

## **VOCATIONAL TRAINING**

Vocational education or skill based training are in certain disciplines which enables youths to acquire skills on traditionally non-academic and totally related to specific trade, occupation or vocation. It helps unemployed youths, persons with disabilities, rural women's to be skilled and in turn, offers better employment opportunities both in private and public sector.



Taking into account this aspect in view, the Organisation has been conducting Vocation are taken for the self employment by establishing linkaged with different Marketing Agencies. Training on Coir products, Phenyl making, Mushroom cultivation were organized for the youth PwDs at Nimapara Block.

### **Diploma in Education Special Education (Hearing Impairment)**

Since 2011, this teachers Certificate Training Course has been running with the approval of Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI), New Delhi a statutory

Body under Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. The examination of students conducted by Ali Yavar Jung National Institute for the Hearing Handicapped (AYJNIHH), Mumbai. The intake capacity of the course is 30. Qualified Rehabilitation professional providing their lecturer in the course and the organization have different lab, special school, library and resource materials as per need of the course. Organizations have also Hostel facilities for students those are interested to stay at Hostel during their Study.

The major objective of this course is to develop Human Resource in the field of Special Education. Diploma in Special Education is an important step towards generating teachers to promote and facilitate full and equal enjoyment of child rights and fundamental freedoms from pre-school to primary level. The said course envisages addressing the special needs of children who are Deaf & Hard of Hearing.

### **Diploma in Education Special Education (Visual Impairment)-**

The organization is conducting Diploma in Education Special Education Visual Impairment Course with the approval from Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI), Govt. of India, and New Delhi. The intake capacity of the course is 30. The 2 year courses have 4 semesters and the exam of the said course is conducted by National Institute for the Visually Handicapped (NIVH), Dehradun.





### **Diploma in Education Special Education (Cerebral Palsy)**

Considering successful running of Diploma level Certificate Course in the field of Visually Impaired and Hearing Impaired, the Organisation started the above certificate course on Cerebral Palsy with approval of Rehabilitation Council of India and recognized by the Government of Odisha with intake capacity of 25 in each batch from the academic year 2018-2020.

### **Bachelor in Education Special Education (Hearing Impairment) - B.Ed.Spl.Ed (HI)**

Since 2013, the organization is conducting Bachelor in Education on Hearing Impairment with the recognition of Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI), Govt. of India, and New Delhi. The intake capacity of the course is 30 and affiliated by Utkal University, Vanivihar Bhubaneswar. After completing this course, the trainees are engaged as Teacher and Block Resource Teacher in different Government establishments.

### **Bachelor in Education Special Education (Visual Impairment) - B.Ed.Spl.Ed (VI)**

The organization is conducting B.Ed. in Special Education on Visually Impaired from 2018 with the approval of Rehabilitation Council of India and being recognized by the Department of Social Security and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities. This Training course is affiliated with Utkal University, Vani Vihar with intake capacity of 30.



### **Advance Certificate Course in Inclusive Education and Cross Disabilities**

This Certificate Training Course was conducted by the Organisation with the support of National Institute for Empowerment of the Persons with Multiple Disabilities, Chennai with approval of Rehabilitation Council of India for the In-service Teacher, Special Educators, Rehabilitation professionals to validity of their Training Certificate and renewal of RCI Regd. Certificate. This Training programme was organized from 27.08.2018 to 31.08.2018 for 30 Participants.

### **Special School for the Deaf**

The special school for the Deaf is running at Nimapara since 1998. At present, 43 children with Hearing Impaired are getting education from Class 1<sup>st</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup>. The Trained Special Teacher has been employed to teach as per the norms of the Special School and 4 students have successfully passed out from this Institution. The Organisation has applied Grant-in-aid in favour of the School to the Department of SSEPD, Government of Odisha.

## **Inclusive School**

An Inclusive School (EKALAVYA SHIKSHA KENDRA) is running by the Organisation at NIMAPARA from Preparatory to Class – 4<sup>th</sup> standards with enrollment of Children with Disabilities includes Intellectual disabilities, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation, Hearing and Visually Impaired. As per the norms of the education, trained Teachers are engaged in the school. The class in the school is being done followed by joyful and participation Approach. The School has adequate Teaching Learning Materials, play Materials to enhance the skill and capacity for effective participation. Till to now 218 Students are enrolled in the above School which is a remarkable achievement in the Area

## **Counseling Centre**

It has been observed that, the Persons with Disabilities in the rural community are facing insurmountable difficulties to know about various information on education, self-employment and entitlements. Realizing these aspects in view, the Organisation has started a Counseling Centre to provide information to PwDs, family members by the Professionals of the Organisation. This Centre is immensely helping them to know about various Schemes/Programmes, entitlements as well as their Rights.

## **Inauguration of “Ratnakar Dash Higher Secondary School for the Persons with Visual Disabilities.” – first ever initiatives .**

It was felt that, large number of Persons with Visual Disabilities deprived to get Higher Education due to lack of financial and moral support. Realizing the above facts in view, the Organisation has started a Higher Secondary School for the Persons with Visual Disabilities particularly for poor and from the Tribal District of Odisha to ensure by Sd. Samira Ranjan Das, Hon'ble MLA, GOP-Nimapara cum Chairman, District Planning Board, Puri with august presence of *Padmashree* Sd. Bhabani Charan Pattnaik, Freedom fighter and Ex-Mp Dr. Minati Behera, State Commissioner for PwDs, Sd. R.K. Sharma, Asst. Director, VRCH, Dr. Pravakar Tripathy, Sr. Lecturer, DIET, Puri, Sd. Mrutunjay Mishra, Sr. Advocate, Sd. Dillip Pattnaik, Sr. Advocate, Sd. Bimbadhar Behera, Rotarian, Bhubaneswar, Sd. Sanatan Pradhan, Chairman, NAC, Nimapara, Dr. Santosh Ku. Panigrahi, Asst. Director, IGNOU, Dr. Prasanta Bhuyan, Delhi University. The necessary facilities like free education, Accommodation, Fooding, Dress materials and Teaching equipments are providing by the Organisation. Glad to mention that, 109 Visually Impaired Students from different parts of the State has been admitted in to this establishment. This Higher Secondary School has got permission from the Government of Odisha, Department of School & Mass Education from the Academic year 2019-20 with intake capacity of 64. The initiatives are highly appreciated by various stake holders, civil society and departments.





### REHABILITATION AND THERAPEUTIC SERVICES FOR THE PERSONS WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES

The most vulnerable groups in the society i.e. Cerebral Palsy, Autism, Mental Retardation and Multiple Disabilities have been deprived to ensure minimum support to sustain in their living society. Considering their manifold difficulties, the Organisation has established a Therapeutic Centre for Children/Persons with Intellectual Disabilities at Nimapara from the year 2018-19. Thanks to Department of Social Security and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Government of Odisha in extending financial support for 30 Beneficiaries on Non-residential Mode. The Professionals like Physiotherapist, Occupational Therapist, Speech & Audio Therapist, Special Educator are engaged to provide Intervention as well as Rehabilitation Services. Apart these, Parents Meeting are being organized with involvement of stake holders, civil society. This programme is really impacted among the community.

### CENTRE FOR CHILDREN WITH AUTISM

A Centre for the Children with Autism Spectrum disorder was established by the Organisation at Nimapara with the financial support of Department of Social Security and Empowerment of the Persons with Disabilities, Odisha to provide therapeutic as well as education to such Children by the Professionals. Now 30 children with Autism have been enrolled in to this Centre. The parents, family members are extending all sorts of support for mainstreaming in their living society. The Centre was visited by the District Social Security Officer, Puri.





## CRE/ WORKSHOP

### 1. STATE LEVEL WORKSHOP ON EARLY INTERVENTION AND EDUCATIONAL EMPOWERMENT OF PWDs.

This 2 days State level Workshop on Early Intervention and Educational Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities was organized with approval of Rehabilitation Council of India and NIEPMD, Chennai on Early Intervention and Educational Empowerment of persons with disabilities from 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> December – 2018 at Nimapara to update the knowledge of special educator, Therapist working in the field of disabilities. The participants from various educational Institutions including government sector from different parts of the state participated in this training programme.

The professionals of NIEPMD and highly experience Resource persons were invited to take session on Therapy Intervention, vocational empowerment and education of persons/children with disabilities. The outcome of the programme to aware the participants on RPD Act, 2016 and how to implement its various provision for the inclusion of persons with disabilities.



### 2. ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF IGNOU ON IMPLEMENTING EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES IN ODISHA

IGNOU, Regional Centre, Bhubaneswar in collaboration with Pingalakhi Public welfare Organisation, Nimapara conducted a workshop on “ Role and Responsibilities of IGNOU on implementing Educational programs in Odisha on 25<sup>th</sup> May- 2018 at 10.00 Am in the conference Hall of the Organisation. The Objective of the workshop to develop the educational status among the students belongs to poor and SC and ST those are depriving to get education under general educational scenario and to provide the educational facilities of IGNOU to the PRI personnel and stake holders.

The Workshop was inaugurated by Prof. Dr. Manmohan Mohanty, an eminent educationalist/ scientist and Dr. Santosh Kumar Panigrahi, Asst. Director of IGNOU. The other dignitaries are Dr. Prabhakar Tripathy, Sr. Faculty, DIET, and Puri. Mr. Raj kishore Sabut, President, PPWO and Mr. Gagan Bihari Das, Principal College of special college. With these objectives, the instintual communities like Principal of the colleges, Educationalist, social activists, Media persons and PRI personnel. Mr. Rajkishore Sabut, President, PPWO. Welcome the Guests and participants and preside over the program.

The participants expressed their views and opinions in the open discussion session and they highly satisfied. It is true; the message has been disseminated to the rural community through PRI Members and social Activists to take advantages in getting educational facilities of IGNOU.



## **Workshop on Autism**

One day Workshop was organized on Identification, Assessment and Management of Autism in collaboration with IGNOU, Regional Centre, Bhubaneswar and SSEPD Deptt. Govt. of Odisha on dated 23.02.2019. The programme was started at 10:30am with the presence of State Consultant on Disabilities Dr. Sareeta Behera, SSEPD Deptt. Govt. of Odisha, Mr. Gagan Bihari Das, Principal, College of Special Education, PPWO and Mr. Gajendra Pradhan, Project Coordinator, PPWO. In the present context it is too difficult for parents to knowing that his/her child is Autism or Mental Retardation. So, we organized this workshop for our students and staff who are going to the grassroots level and identified the children with autism and assessment them then make a complete rehabilitation plan with

consultation of deferent professionals. Dr. Sareeta Behera briefly told about various aspects of Autism Spetrum, its causes and social implications. There are 100 participants like special educators, Students, Parents actively participated and expressed their thoughts in the above Workshop.

### **3. Zonal Level Workshop (CRE) on “Policy and Practices on Inclusive Education”**

A two days Zonal Level Workshop (CRE) on “Policy and Practices on Inclusive Education was organized from 27<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> May, 2019 at Town Hall of Nimapara, Puri, Odisha by Pingalakhi Public Welfare Organisation, Nimapara with the approval of Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI), New Delhi in his office letter no. 7-16 (Msc./)2019-RCI 5434 dated. 22.03.2019. The theme of the workshop is very essential for the today’s education system as well as professionals those are working in the field of disabilities rehabilitation.

In the first day on 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2019 the registration of participants has started from 9.30am and there are 75nos. of professionals from different sector i.e. Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, Therapist, Special Educator, Social Worker and Resource Teacher enrolled for taking the CRE programme. The inaugural ceremony of the two days Zonal Level Workshop on policy and practices on Inclusive education on 9.30am with the presence of Prof. Satya Mohapatra, Chairman, Zonal Coordination Committee, RCI, Dr. Sakti Prasad Dash, Director, SVNIRTAR, Bairoi, Cuttack, Sj. Rajkishore Sabut, President, PPWO, Sj. Dillip Kumar Pattnaik, Sr. Advocate, Sj. Gagan Bihari Das, Principal, PPWO and Sj. Padmalochan Mohanty, A.O. PPWO. Prof. Satya Mohapatra addresses the participants about Role and responsibilities of Rehabilitation Professionals, RCI’s different circular etc. Sj. Sabut, President, PPWO was also addresses on various issues in the field of Special Education and rehabilitation. Other guests also share their experience to the participants.

Dr. Sakti Prasad Dash, Director, SVNIRTAR had take the first presentation on the topic of “Early Intervention and Inclusive Education”. Issues related to early intervention and inclusive education was deeply discussed with the

Participants with good interaction. Mainly focus on the multiple Disabilities, Cerebral Palsy and Locomotors Disabilities and various way of intervention for promote Inclusive education.

Dr. Premananda Mishra, TCTVH, NIEPVD, Regional Centre, Bhubaneswar was take the second session on the topic of “National & International Perspective on Inclusive Education”. Dr. Mishra vividly discussed about inclusive education and different country has taken specific drive for it sustainability. Also share his experience on present scenario in India for Implementation of Inclusive Education. All the participants have actively interacted with the resource person on the present Perspectives of National and International on Inclusive education and various issues.

Swarnalata Panda, Lecturer, TCTD, AYJNISHD, Regional Centre, Bhubaneswar was take the post lunch session on the topic of “Changing Teaching Practices to respond student diversity”. She is a very knowledgeable and state level resource person. She discussed with the some brain storming activities. And create the environment to feel reality of diversity and its meaning. Then also share various method and technique to helpful for handling the diverse learner in the classroom situations.

On the second day 28<sup>th</sup> May, 2019 the first session started by Dr. R.K. Sharma, Asst. Director, NCSCDA, Bhubaneswar. He is a national level Resource Person and discussed the topic of Vocational Inclusion of Persons with Disabilities. Dr. Sharma discussed about various schemes, agencies, placement centre, skill development programme etc. to the participants and role of various training centre with provision for persons with disabilities. Role of MSJE, SSEPD department, Govt. of Odsha and Skill Development authority to include different schemes that include the PwDs in mainstream and promote their inclusion.

Mr. Gagan Bihari Das, Principal, Pingalakhi College of Special Education, Nimapra, Puri was sharing the knowledge about various programme and policies on Inclusive Education. Mr. Das was discussed different policies and programmes from ancient period to twenty first century which promote, protect and ensure the dignity of PwDs. As well as share the information about educational rights of the child to avail educational opportunities in their door step.





#### **4. CRE PROGRAMME ON “PARENTS AS EQUAL PARTNERS IN THE INTERVENTION PROCESS”**

The inauguration function was started at 9.30am with the chairmanship of S.J. Rajkishore Sabut, president, PPWO after lighting the lamp Mr. G.B. Das, principal, college of special Education give the welcome address and objective of the programme. Then S.J. Anil Kumar Biswal, Ex-BEO, Nimapada Block address about quality of education and role of special trained teacher in the present scenario, S.J. Sanatan Pradhan, chairman also said PPWO activities in the Nimapada Block and appreciated MR. Sabut work for empowerment of persons with disabilities.

#### **5. HAND WASH PROGRAMME**

According to the sources of World Health Organization and other Health Service provider Institutions at National and International level, the people are being affected in various chronic diseases due to lack of awareness in maintaining adequate cleanness in and within their environment. It is also true that the inhabitation in poor hygiene environment and belongs to poor community are facing insurmountable difficulties in maintaining Health without having any diseases. UNICEF has been consistently given importance in hand wash before Eating, Toileting with soap and ignores bad practices. IGNOU, Regional Centre Bhubaneswar realizing these aspects in view promoting to various organization in organizing Hand Wash programme in different location in the State. The Hand Wash programme was organized on 29<sup>th</sup> of October 2018 at Ekalavya Sikshya Kendra under Pingalaxhi Public Welfare Organisation, Nimapada. In this event, the children of the school and parents were participated. The Para-Medical

staff of the Pingalakhi Seva Sadan, Nimapada, coordinated the programme through practical expose Total 125 both Students and Parents are actively involved. The Medical Expertise and Teaching faculties of the Institute talk about various aspects as well as its importance of Hand Wash. Water, soap were provided to the students and parents and practically carried in the home and school campus and essential before activity in the area.

#### **6. PUBLICITY OF IGNOU PROGRAMME AT GRASS ROOTS LEVEL IN NIMAPADA BLOCK OF PURI DISTRICT.**

The Organisation in collaboration with IGNOU, Regional Centre, and Bhubaneswar created massive publicity in the rural village about various activities/programmes of IGNOU and how the general people can take advance by doing such type of course. The objectives of the programme to aware stake holders, Community Based Organizations as well as civil society. This awareness campaign was organized in different locations from 04.11.2018 to 14.11.2018 with the support of Mobile vehicle and experts and campaign covered all the 32 Grampanchayat in Nimapada Block. The IGNOU Academic course public programme has established a new arena in rural community of Nimapada block with a hope and aspiration to get higher education for building a bright future. The poor and deprived students unable for higher education will have opportunity to go ahead. The parents, community stake holders, civil society able to know about various courses of IGNOU which will inspire them to encourage the students for further education. The students with SC/ST will go ahead by getting timely education for their future development. This publicity campaign was highly appreciated by the community based Organization and educational Institution in the area for greater interest of the drop out students in the village area.

#### **7. Workshop on “Addressing Barriers in the Environment and Universal Design”**

This workshop was organized with approval of Rehabilitation Council of India, Delhi from 24th January to 26<sup>th</sup> January 2019 for Rehab. Professionals, Special Educators, Teacher and stake holders, The Objectives of the programme to aware general people to protect environment realizing the present context and to update the skill and knowledge of the Rehabilitation Professionals which may enable them to disseminate Message among the community about the importance of Barriers free Environment and help the principles of universal design and accessible the environment in the field of education, work, recreation etc.



## Library

As number of Training Programme in the area of education, Training are being carried out by the Organisation, a Library has established to meet day to day study materials of the students, Lecturers. Thousand of Study books, Journals, publication are kept in the Library. The National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disabilities has extended kind support for extension of the LIBRARY.



## DISTRIBUTION OF FRUITS AND BREADS TO THE HOSPITAL PATIENTS.
