INTRODUCTION






Nimtouri Tamluk Unnayan Samity is under the Society Registration Act 1961 & PWD registered organization in Purba Medinipur district, West Bengal. It is one of the leading voluntary organization of the district working for the welfare and rehabilitation of disadvantaged group of society specially for the divyangjan since 2000. The organization is situated near the newly proposed site for the district head quarter and by the side of NH-41. It has its own well-built infrastructure on approx 54,000 Sq.ft. land. Here a total rehabilitation campus has been set-up where each divyangjan has the freedom to work, play, learn and live at one's own space.

In the reporting year the organization has successfully completed 22 years. Our organization won the '**State Award-2010**' as best organization granted by Hon'ble Governor of West Bengal, for outstanding achievement in providing rehabilitation services. Hon'ble Founder **General Secretary** of this organization has been awarded the '**State Award**' for **Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities-2013** in the category of outstanding individual working in the year 2013 on 3rd December at Kolkata Rabindra Sadan by the Hon'ble Governor, Govt. of W.B. Mr. M.K. Narayanan and Deptt. of Woman and Child, Govt. of W.B. & the Commissioner (Disabilities), W.B., One student of this organization **Sili Acharya (M.R.)** has been awarded **Role Model State Award-2015** for her outstanding achievement, Also Priyanka Mal (V.I. 100%) achieved Role Model State Award-2016 for Outstanding Creative Child, Also Rabindranath Sangram (OH 100%) achieved Role Model State Award 2016 for Outstanding performance in Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Also Sourav Sahoo (O.H. 100%) achieved Role Model State Award 2016 for Outstanding Vocational Training Instructor. Mira (M.R. 50%) inmate of Juvenile Justice Home won Bronze Medal in 2019 in Special Olympic Bharat at the event of Floor Ball. Mira (M.R.- 50%) inmate of Juvenile Justice Home achieved State Award-2021 for Best Sports Person. Ganga (HI - 90%) inmate of Swadhar Greh achieved State Award-2021 for Best Employee. During this year, we have learnt lessons about the way and have gained strength for the things we had done.

The reporting year is a year of mixed experiences for us. Where on one side, we have achieved success in academic, sports, cultural, improvement of infrastructure, on the other side, we have to face a lot of financial crisis due to non-release of Government grant-in-aid. To continue the education and training of the divyangjan in regular way is very hard to us due to non-release of grant-in-aid.

But still the organization is supporting over 450 divyangjan children through residential education, Vocational Training and care & protection. On our way towards social welfare, we always express our heartiest gratitude with due honour to our Founder Chief Patron, Late **Dr. Sushil Kumar Dhara**, great freedom-fighter, our Chief Advisor, Hon'ble Ex. M.P. Our Hon'ble MP and MLA & Minister-In-Charge, Govt. of W.B. and authorities of LIC Golden Jubilee Foundation, our well wishers, Advisory Committee, local people along with the respective public representatives and all officers of State and Central Government who have extended their hands for co-operation to achieve our success for the welfare of helpless people of the Society. Their valuable guidance has always helped us to overcome the various barriers and to achieve success.

- u) To make it as an eco-friendly family based organization.

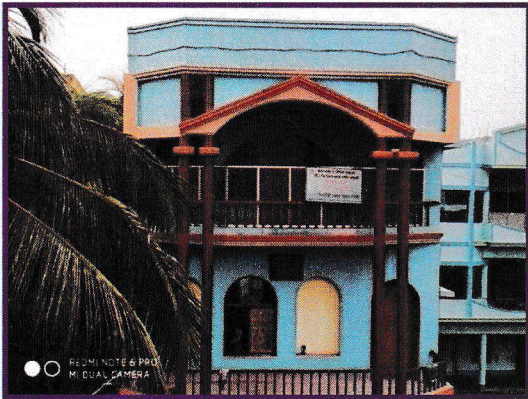

SWADHAR GREH

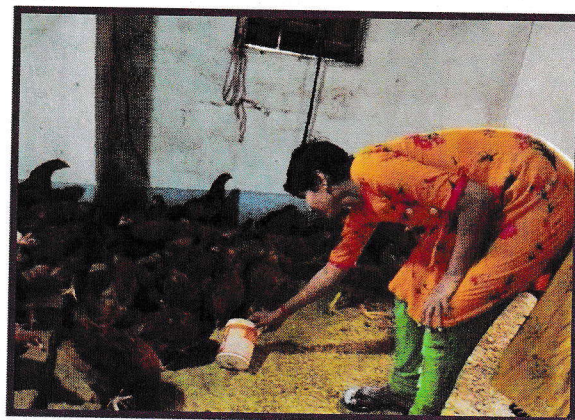
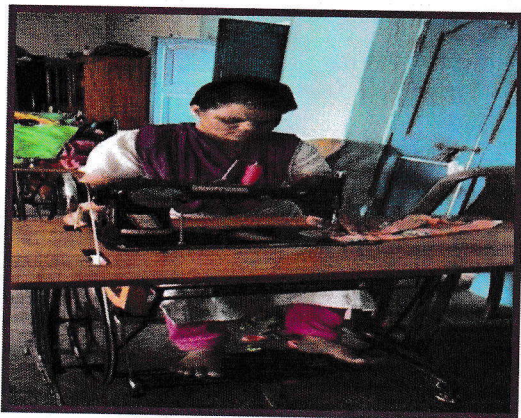
A Swadhar Shelter Home had been running for shelter & rehabilitation of women in distress condition under grant-in-aid of Ministry of Women & Child Development, Govt. of India since 2008-2009. But January, 2016 the name of Swadhar Shelter Home is converted to Swadhar Greh. At present, there are 33 inmates and 2 children are staying in this home. 28 inmates are mentally ill out of 33 inmates. Along with shelter and protection, the inmates are given regular counseling and vocational training in different trades like straw craft, tailoring, gardening, poultry farm etc. As per their skill & choice, proper staff as per norms has been engaged for implementation of the project. A counselor, social worker has been engaged for counseling and case study of the inmates. The inmates are referred by ACJM, CJM, SDO / SDM / EM & DSWO from police custody and from other districts also.

We have a separate well-accommodated & well-protected infrastructure for running this home. CCTV is placed at the entrance, exit place. But government has not provided nurse and cook for this project. We are suffering for above subject. Regular health check-up are doing from



BPHC, Dist. Hospital and also a Registered Medical Doctor.

But most unfortunately during the three years i.e. 2013-2014, 2014-2015 & 2015-2016 (April to December) we haven't received any grant-in-aid from the Ministry for this continuing project. Due to irregular release of Grant-in-aid, we are facing very much financial crisis to maintain security, food and rehabilitation of the inmates. If the grant is released in time which is very necessary for such homes then better services could be provided to the inmates.

Year of 2022-23, 10 inmates and five children are admitted in our Swadhar Greh, 16 inmates and five child are restored and transferred. T.V., Ludo, Home Theater etc are provided for their recreation. All inmates practice free hand exercise, yoga, skipping, run etc in regular basis. Sometimes we arrange picnic, outing and take them to visit puja pandal. Our Swadhar Greh inmates celebrate some days, like International Women's Day, Independence Day, Rabindra Jayanti, World Health Day.

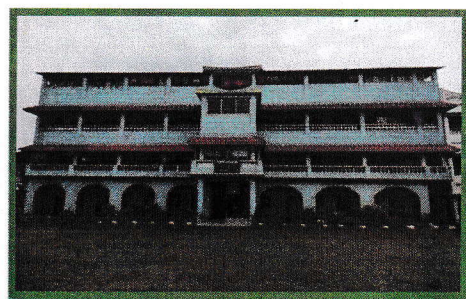
Nimtouri Tamluk Unnayan Samity, Juvenile Justice Home(Snehanir) under Juvenile Justice Act - 2000 (Care & Protection)

Nimtouri Tamluk Unnayan Samity, Juvenile Justice Home (Snehanir) under J.J. Act runs since 2008, with the Sanctioned 50(fifty) for M.R Girls, under the Dept. of Women & Child Development and Social Welfare, Govt. of West Bengal. At Present there are 36(thirty six) inmates are staying in Juvenile Justice Home. These inmates are referred by CWC, Purba Medinipur and different Court such as Ld. CJM, ADJ, Purba Medinipur, ACJM Haldia/Contai and sometimes also come from police custody. Not only M.R, but also Cerebral Palsy affected inmates are staying here. All facilities are provided to all categories of inmates such-as health, care & protection, sports, culture, special education and schooling, recreation, rehabilitation etc.

Building: - We have provided their category wise well accommodated & well protected infrastructure with good and airy atmosphere. C.C.TV is placed at the entrance, backside, exiting place and common place of Home.

Educational Facility:- Out of 37 no of children, 09 CWSN attends spl. School and 05 CWSN go to formal school in our campus, one resident attach with Open school. Rest inmates reads to spl. Educator with the help of TLM. Everyday educator attends the inmates who are under formal education.

Medical facility:- Regular basis health check up is running from B.P.H.C, Dist. Hospital, Bangur psychiatry Institute. Besides that Nurse



& Paramedical always give support with their services. Psychiatrist, Home's Physician Dr. Tarasankar Sahoo and BPHC, District Hospital Team attend our Home.

Covid-19:- During pandemic, we maintained covid-19 protocol. All children wear mask, use sanitizer, and maintain social distance when they attend group activity. They use hand wash with interval also. Beside that District Fire Brigade sanitized our home in regular basis. In this time a safe Home was founded. All get covid vaccine.

Vocational Training:- Except CP inmates, all MR inmates attend vocational class. Sometimes they make Jutes materials, greetings card, rakhi etc. Five CWSN inmates learns Tailoring. For their mental refreshment, they attach with gardening.



Counselling:- The inmates are given regular Counseling support and guidance for their betterment in well decorated counseling room. Some inmates get counseling support from Bangur Psychiatry Dept. and District Hospital.



Cultural Activity:- Few inmates are interested towards music and dance. They attend dance and music class in weekly basis and practice regularly. Besides that, they are learning drawing, painting, recitation. A wall magazine 'Srijan' is published quarterly in Home campus. There some creativity of the inmates is shown.

Indoor and outdoor Game:- All inmates practice free hand exercise, Yoga, Skipping, Run, Kho-kho, Ludo etc. in regular basis. Annual sports are held in every year.



Recreation:- All children are participated outing one time through the year and they enjoyed a lot. Picnic also arranged once in a year. Besides that, they watch T.V and listen to music every day also



watch movie in big screen by projector machine. Our organization arranged Durga Puja at Home campus. All children enjoyed a lot.

Day Celebration:- Our beloved D.M Antara Madam launched a programme “Aaj Amar Janmadin” for Home children. We celebrate the Janmadin of all inmates to make confidence building. 9th June, 14th November are observed as Child Protection Day, Children’s Day and Child Rights week, Celebration of 15th August as Independence Day.



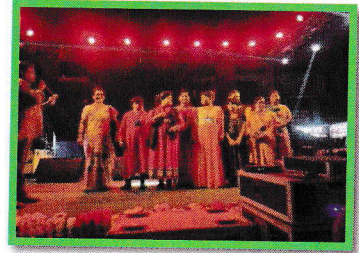
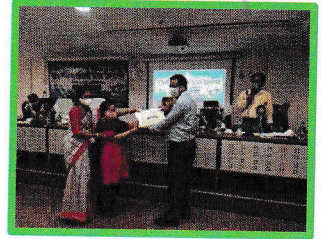

Office Record:- We maintain all Official record properly. Case study report, ICP is also prepared and submitted to the CWC Board and DCPU office. Regular home visit is done by the Supdt. C.W.O & Counselor. In this year 2022-23, 6 (six) children were admitted to our J.J. home. After 6 years, we traced out Mira’s own house at Maharashtra .She has gone her own home with her mother on 2nd March,2023. It is a great pleasure.
