AASHRAYA believes in overall development of the excluded community by providing therapy to children with intellectual disabilities, support to school for promotion of kitchen garden, exchange of culture among the students of India and Germany through letter crossing programmes. Support to excluded communities is the core objective of all developmental initiatives of AASHRAYA.

This represents a structural break that steps up demand for developing a therapy centre for children with intellectual disabilities with the support of local therapist. Now we are in a position to provide support to 20 children with intellectual disabilities which will soon reach to 50 through aware outreach camps and awareness campaign.

In the financial year 2018-19, AASHRAYA in total directly reached out to 5000 families in underserved to under serve area in different parts of Odisha. We look forward in future to work intensely for the community we are serving.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our partners, donors, volunteers for their strong and consistent support, without which we would not have been able to achieve so much. I would especially like to thank our Board Members for their contribution, particularly when we needed to find solutions to big development challenges.

Directly reached out to 200 children with disabilities and providing them awareness on early identification of disabilities and therapy to most acute cases.





OUR ACHIVEMENTS IN BRIEF

REHABILITATION OF PHYSICAL AND MENTAL CHALLENGED SOCIALLY DISADVANTAGED PERSON ALONG WITH THERAPY TO CHILDREN WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES SUPPORTED BY SSEPD, GOO

Objectives:

- Our main aim is to help children of PWDs who are neurologically affected. We have been treating child from 0-20 years age
- We are treating PWDs s as Cerebral palsy (CP), Autism Spectrum Disorder(ASD), Hydrocephalus, Down's syndrome and Other Chromosomal Disorder or Genetic Disorder
- Since 2011 down the lane HTTC has been a hub for PWDs s and their parents to provide them a hope for better life, abide from the social
 - stigma and problems they face in day to day life.



- It is always the first priority of HTTC to make a child socially stable and independent.
- The PwDs and their careers are always been at the peak of satisfaction regarding the provided services and counseling.

AWARENESS PROGRAM FOR DISABILITY PERSONS WITH PARIENTS SUPPORTED BY NIEPMD, CHENNAI

Under this program AASHRAYA has been giving more importance to integral growth of persons having different types of disabilities namely Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mental retardation includina multiple disabilities. have We been educational conductina and awareness events related to social integration of PwDs covering parents and care takers at community level.



EAST ZONE LEVEL DIVYAN CRICKET TOURNAMENT IN BHUBANESWAR

A three days East Zone Divyang Cricket Tournament in organized in Bhubaneswar with the active support of local cricket lovers who provide free – Paramount Ground adjacent to BJEM School in BJB Nagar. The programme is also supported by Rotary Club. After three days programme Odisha team become the tournament winner. Our Divyang Cricket association is affiliated to Mumbai Divyang cricket association.

DISABILITY CARE & SUPPORT PROGRAMME

During the reporting year, our grass-root volunteers reached to the houses of selected PwDs and educated their parents and caretakers, as a result 35 people of children with disabilities have been covered under social security schemes and entitlements. Besides AASHRAYA also organized 3 nos YOGA camps in which PwD beneficiaries were also covered.

AASHRAYA by utilizing its own resource has been providing necessary care support to selected PwDs of MR, CP & Autism categories thorough running a disability care and support centre at Sahid Nagar of Bhubaneswar, the capital city of Odisha. Under this centre, it provides institution care free education using appropriate TLM, speech therapy, physiotherapy, YOGA therapy along with recreational facilities such as painting, drawing, indoor games, easy physical exercises and rehabilitative services etc.

AASHRAYA has realized that, many PwDs silently suffer a lot as they face domestic violence, social stigma and discrimination. For this reasons they pass their time with fear and insecurity. Being the slave of pitiable situation, those who migrates outsides to beg alms, become victimized, exploited and abused in the hands of anti-socials. PwD

communities of different locations of the state really struggle to lead a quality life since they remain isolated from mainstream development schemes, programs and facilities even though several legislation and protection Acts are prepared for their inclusion and integration. To many extents their human rights are violated in different forms.

AASHRAYA's frontline workers are voluntarily dedicated to create awareness among the care takers of PwD communities. Over the years, it has been organizing community based awareness activities like parents meetings, awareness rally and observation of different days, which has become effective to link the eligible PwDs with available care support and facilities.

AASHRAYA observed the "World Disability **Day"** on 3rd Dec 2016 in Bhubaneswar (Capital city of Odisha state). More than 200 disability persons participated in this state level event. Selected PwD participants had received prizes and certificates for their outstanding performances in the fields of leadership, voluntarism, social works, education, art, culture, selftraining, enterprise promotion, inclusion in social welfare schemes including sports and games. They were appreciated by the special invitees for their name and fame not only at state level but also at national level.

The objective of this Day was to assess the current status of the Convention on the

Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) and SDGs and laying the foundation for a future of greater inclusion for persons with disabilities. Other objectives were to promote an understanding of disability issues and mobilize support for the dignity, rights and wellbeing of persons with disabilities. The theme for this year's International Day was "Achieving 17 Goals for the Future We Want". This theme notes the recent adoption of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the role of these goals in building a more inclusive and equitable world for persons with disabilities.

MULTI FACILITY CARE FOR OLDER PERSONS

AASHRAYA has internalized the care and service for elderly people as they feel lonely because of their children migrate distance places. In reality they face a lot of problems and psychosocial complications at their old ages. Like young adults every senior citizens of our nation also deserve to live with dignity. As we know that, they at their elderly stage mostly require regular care support and treatment.

However, with a view to help such type of disabilities in our locality, we have been running a multi-facility care center where they are getting need-based reactionary facilities. This facility works as a recreation centre for the target elder people since they can get information regarding present socio-political, socio-economical affairs and the social changes occurring owing to modern civilization even at countryside. At present the daily visitors of old persons have raised from 50 to 60 per day. They have been provided free medical checkups, medicines, First Aid and breathing exercises under this centre aims at making them stay active and stress free. Senior citizens, especially the widows those were facing social stigma and discrimination many times and those were regarded as unwanted elements in their own homes, now feeling comfort for their friendship with other persons.

BASELINE SURVEY ON PWDs:

AASHRAYA's volunteers conducted household level baseline survey in identified urban slums of Bhubaneswar in a participatory approach. The purpose was to select vulnerable PwDs to carry out our planned activities in coming days. The survey was useful to identify people with Autism, Cerebral Palsy, and Mental Retardation including multiple disabilities. Use of PRA tools and active participation of local volunteers as well as the social opinion leaders of the slum communities during this survey had increased the parents and caretakers level of awareness. The survey information also became useful for AASHRAYA to identify the barriers that contribute to the problems PwDs and their caretakers encounter, which, in turn, became useful for planning and service development. The need assessment was also useful to procure educational materials which were distributed later among the selected PwDs. During the survey process our volunteers also conducted community meetings, which created sensitization among the caretakers and parents for their role to do social integration and mainstreaming of the Persons with Disabilities.

PROMOTION OF SHGs OF DISABLED PEOPLE

With a view to empower and strengthen the abilities of persons with disabilities, **AASHRAYA** has been working since the past quarters. To this year end, we have formed five SHGs of PwDs and organized residential training programs on handicraft products and computer. These trainings have improved their productive skills as they have been promoted economic activities at their individual level.

Outputs achieved:

- 54 nos. PwDs of SC category are trained & skilled for which they have started their enterprise which help them for livelihood promotion and income generation
- ♦ The training has not only increased their skills & enterprise competencies, but also improved their soft skills and leadership
- ◆ They are educated and informed on available facilities, scopes and opportunities for sustainable livelihood

Increased in livelihood potential among the target beneficiaries based on market demanded products for which a sizable portion of the trained youth can enter to the workforce in the long run

DRUG DE-ADDICTION PROGRAMME

Sensitization programme on addition of different products which includes alcohol, tobacco both smoking and chewing etc. is organized on 31st May which is observed as "World No Tobacco Day". In this programme we have involved youths both who are addicted and who are de-addicted with our counseling. We also called recourse persons from different institutes who are working on mouth cancer. The addicted youth promised to leave tobacco with the support of our organization.

EDUCATION AND HEALTH CARE AT SCHOOL

In this programme there was letter crossing among the school children of India and Germany. This programme is supported by German Mandelzweig Projekhilife e.v. The students of both the countries get an opportunity to interact with each other to learn the culture.

SCHOOL KITCHEN GARDEN PROGRAMME

In this programme nine schools are supported with seeds and other support to develop kitchen garden. In this project the students took the lead role to develop the kitchen garden with the active guidance of the teachers and SMC members. It is a great learning for all so that they have started developing the similar kitchen garden in their backyard.

AGRICULTURE PROGRAMME

Fifty five farmers are provided with technical support by our technical team. They are using indigenous seeds and organic manures in the course of production. There is great finding that the farmers have received almost same amount of paddy what they were getting with the support of inorganic products. So they are motivating others to go for organic farming in the next year.

YOGA CAMPS

Yoga programmes are organized in all the nine schools. In this programme the trained yoga teachers are invited to educate the students. It has motivated the students who are continuing the same in their yoga classes and in their home.

ANTI - CHILD LABOUR PROGRAMME

Our organization organized sensitization programme among the migrant workers from different parts of Odisha and are working as labour. The programmes for the education of the children are organized. Apart from that the migrant populations are educated about their benefits/ schemes provided by government.

NURSERY RAISING

The support for kitchen garden is provided in the schools. So quality seedlings are raised in two nurseries raised by the SHG groups. After selling the seedlings the SHGs received an income of Rs.10,000/- as profit.

SHG FORMATION AND STRENGTHENING

Our organization activated 14 defunct SHGs in Puri district. Two of them are involved in nursery raining and rest women groups are provided training for enhancing their skill on different aspects.

EDUCATION SUPPORT TO POOR STUDENTS

Our organization this year provided computer training to the 20 poor girls in Jajpur district. This is self sponsored programme and three of them have already get placement in Bhubaneswar. In this programme we also try to educate them on spoken English, skill on sales etc. These professional courses have really helped them to get the job.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME FOR ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT

a. Khali plate making

Two SHGs are provided training on Khali plate and dana making. After getting the training they already started their activities. We have helped them in bank linkages. All are now part of financial inclusion programme of the government.

b. Readymade garment

Ten women of three SHGs are trained on readymade garment making. After the training they started stitching the garments for the students of the schools and colleges.

c. Mushroom cultivation

The members of three SHGs are trained on mushroom cultivation. After the training they have already started the activity. They need further handholding to get spun and marketing of the produces.

AASHRAYA has developed a programme for all the SHG members to be the part and partial of financial inclusion. They are availing all the benefits like insurances for them and their family members. Apart from that the SHGs are skilled for marketing of their product locally as well as through marketing network.

FAMILY COUNSELLING

We have a family counseling sell in Bhubaneswar where we support the destitute as per their need. We also counsel the carer of persons with disabilities to reduce their stress and help them to get some sort of engagement in life.

YOUTH CAMPS

Youths are the future power of our country. So we organize three days youth camp of 50 students in summer vacation in Jajpur district, In this programme the youths are trained on life skill, participated in different competitions, involved in decision making process, part and partial of organizing the programme. They really enjoyed it along with a lot of learning

SEMINAR & WORKSHOP

A workshop on Yoga is organized in Nimapada block where the teachers and college students took part. The trainers have informed the participants about the benefits of different yogas for the cure of diseases and keep them fit in life.

SURVEY & RESEACH

Our organization is involved in survey of children with intellectual disabilities in Khurda, Jharsuguda and Jajpur. We have made the categories with the support of specialists. We have made a plan for almost all of them like community based rehabilitation, therapy, skill upgration training, Careers support and suitable rehabilitation strategy for them. It will be worked out soon.

FUTURE COURSE OF ACTION

We have a planned to reach to many more excluded communities through our interventions. We are planning to reach to minimum 100 children with intellectual disabilities by providing them therapy support. We are also planning for the rehabilitation of persons with disabilities and their cares. We will reach to other excluded communities like beggars, trans genders, elders by providing both care and welfare to them and bring them to main stream.
