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#### Foreword

Baldwin Opportunity School is one of the 10 Baldwin Institutions located in Bengaluru. It belongs to the Methodist Church in India.

We are one of the pioneers in the field of special education. It was started in the year 1964 by an American Missionary Miss Anna May Tillou as an extension of Baldwin Girls' High School for the Intellectually Challenged. The school provides Special Education for children in the mild, moderate and severe category of intelligence.

The **Mission** of our school is to achieve excellence and top quality in services while the **Vision** for our students is to educate them, help them to achieve their social needs and to make them an independent and responsible individual in the community with a vocation, which would add a meaning to their lives. To **achieve this vision** we as Educators aim at creating awareness amongst children and society to be sensitive, supportive and to provide opportunities and challenges for children with special needs.

The Global trend is towards Integration and Mainstreaming through community involvement and to create a better life and a better future for such children in society. Commitment to pursue excellence in service has been our focus. The Training involves development of Self Help Skills, Functional Academics, Basic computer Application, Fine and Gross Motor skills, Music, Dance Therapy, Pre-vocational skills, Inclusive Education, Behaviour Modification, Guidance and Counselling. On admission we take students below 11 (Eleven) years.

We have 8 classes viz Learning Lab BGHS Learning Lab BBHS, Intermediate I, Senior Boys, Home Makers Class and Pre-Vocational Unit. The ratio of the class is 8 students is to 1 Special Educator which is as per the norm set by the requirement of Rehabilitation Council of India – New Delhi. A child centered and need based curriculum is followed. Assessments revealed progress in most children and have contributed considerably to enhance the competency and accountability of the School. Counselling and Guidance for parent and family are provided periodically.

We believe that our students after 17 years learn better when they are on their own, this can be possible only if we trust them and let them go. So, instead of starting a Vocational Unit at our own Institution, we have ventured into the neighbourhood which has helped us to get our boys to train in Hotel Management Practical Training, Office Assistance training and Bakery Training since the year 2008. We encourage the boys above 17 years to commute on their own. At school we have Teacher Aide training for girls above 18 years where they assist the teacher in the classroom activities.

We thank God for entrusting us with this challenging responsibility as we look forward every year for God's guiding hand upon us as we challenge the needs of our students, bringing out the hidden talents in every child and encourage them to lead independent lives.

#### YEAR AT A GLANCE

**TOTAL ENROLLMENT:** The total student strength was 37. We have 12 staff. The staff includes the Principal, Manager, 4 Special Educators, 2 Office Staff, 1 Weaver, 2 Helpers, 1 Helper (appointed by BGHS as Watchman) a Driver.

<u>PART TIME STAFF:</u> Speech Therapy for most of our students is essential. A speech therapist on internship from NAISH College works 5 days a week on rotation.

<u>CURRICULUM</u>: An Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) is formulated based on the student's ability and interest. The parents, class teacher, student and the Principal are involved in preparing the IEP. The plan covers – Academics, Functional Academics, Self Help, Social skills, Art and Craft, Gross Motor, Fine Motor, Expressive and Receptive Language, Pre-Vocational Skills which include Bakery and Hotel Management training. Our goal is to make sure the students are independent when they graduate.

<u>CLASS ORGANISATION:</u> The class is grouped according to the child's Mental age and not the Chronological age. The ratio of the class is 7:1 according to the norms of the Rehabilitation Council of India.







Shuttle Relay, obstacle race, Cycle Race, Stacking Cones, Manoeuvre through the cones and Precontested events.


