### THE HOME IS DIVIDED INTO 3 SECTIONS-

1. Snehasadan handicapped children's residential school. Girls 51 boys 74 total 125. Between the age group of 5 to 18 years. Out of this 70 children are of cerebral palsy.

Physically disabled and Cerebral Palsy children are rehabilitated in this section. Along with Education they are treated for their deformity and handicaps by Physiotherapy, Occupational therapy corrective surgeries. Every child get one hour of therapy.

Sr. Lincy Explained about corrective surgeries and physiotherapy for the rehabilitation of the children and parents co-operation in the process. We provide appliances to the students. Sr. Ida explained to the parents their responsibilities that all children are of different categories some are slow some are normal we parents and teachers understand the child and provide guidance help to have an Integral growth rehabilitation with education.
