It is serving the Children With Special Needs (CWSN) especially to children from Below Poverty Line (BPL). The School is a non-Government funded body with strong support from the local community like Rotary Club of Delhi Maurya, Institutional attachments with Asha Kiran the largest residential MR Home in India, other hospitals and NGO's in Delhi / NCR.



The Management of the Society include philanthropists, social activists, special educators, academicians among others. The organization has the support of local leaders and care-givers who jointly work hand in hand with the NGO to achieve the common objectives. The New Generation is also actively associated through the several Schools / Colleges who are associated with the society.

After the completion of all the above programmes; the students are granted registration with RCI and are permitted to work with Children With Special Needs (CWSN).

Vision Institute of Advanced Studies is also an extended arm of the Center for Distance Learning, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi and offers the much sought after Post Graduate Diploma in Guidance & Counselling (PGDGC) as a study centre.

Vision Institute of Advanced Studies is working as a Special Study Centre with Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) for the BAPC & MAPC programmes and is extensively working for the welfare of the Psychology Education domain.



Vision Special School has its arrangement with several Taxi Vans which everyday pick up children from their homes to School in the morning and drop them back in the afternoon. The Children are provided with school Uniforms and material of learning as per their IEP. Parents are called the school each Saturday. Medical check up camps are a regular feature of the school. The school participates regularly in District and other Assessment camps of the Government to grant opportunity to all school children to be given material by the Government including Wheel Chairs, Kits, hearing aids etc.

The School has a unit functioning in the Asha Kiran, Govt of NCT Delhi complex wherein Children of Asha Kiran are also provided with Special Education on regular basis. The school does not charge any fees from the children or the authorities for the same. Vocational Education is one area where the Vision Special School has been able to exemplary work by establishing units in the area of Candle making, jute bag making, computer education, spiral binding and photocopy, cutting & tailoring among others.

5. Report
