TAMANA RESEARCH AND TECHNOLOGY

Tamana Research partners: **IBM Research, Microsoft India, Google for Education, Rolls Royce, NASSCOM, Deakin University Australia, University of Tampere, Finland, IIT-Delhi, ECHO India** and government bodies including **Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment (Research), Ministry of Electronics & IT** among others.

The ACM-Special Interest Group, the world's largest Accessibility and Computing conference, invited Tamana in 2016 to talk about its work done in the field of technology and intellectual disabilities. Mr. Blessin Varkey presented a paper on the same.

Tamana in 2016 partnered with the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Research for "The study of virtual instructional modules - Solar Lantern assembling & use of Bio Fertilizers with children with moderate & severe developmental disabilities".

Microsoft India invited Mr. Blessin Varkey to talk on the initiatives of Tamana on promoting coding among young individuals with developmental disabilities at the Microsoft Enabling Opportunities Conference at Microsoft Headquarters, Singapore in 2016 & at the Microsoft IDC, Hyderabad for Microsoft Confluence in 2017.

In December of 2016, Tamana partnered with Microsoft to organize the first-of-its-kind "*coding for students and young adults with developmental disabilities*" which had a participation of more than 90 students from all across Delhi/ NCR to encourage advance IT skills as vocational training & to prove the potential of the 'special' students to the world.

iTamana.com, an ecommerce based platform for selling Tamana sublimation was developed at Tamana by Mr. Blessin Varkey & Mr. Avneesh Mehrotra.

TAMANA KINDERGARTEN PEER LEARNING PROGRAMME (REVERSE INTEGRATION) (Age range 3 years-12) no. students: 118 (from economically weaker sections)

Tamana admits normal children from economically disadvantaged backgrounds to provide an integrative experience to its special needs students. This programme runs at Autism Centre and Tamana Special Education Centre. These normal children are enrolled from pre nursery to class 5 and study alongside their special needs peers.

These students are taught using the NIOS curriculum. They are provided free books, uniform and midday meal.

EKTA BASTI Tamana's community project at Ekta Vihar R.K.Puram, opened with a new look in the year in month of February 2016. Tamana is providing Crèche and preschool services to 68 toddlers from the basti. In the afternoon remedial classes held for the school

BOYS HOSTEL

A residential programme which caters to special needs males between 9-25 years of age

Total no. of students: 24

Day Boarding Students: 8

Activities of hostel:

1. Activities of daily living like bedmaking, shaving, meal-time activities etc.
2. Academics
3. Gym
4. Computer
5. Hobbies like dance, music, gardening and sports like cricket and badminton

Special activities:

1. Students take part in marathons like "run for a cause" organised by Dr. Lal Singh foundation.

2. Students set up stalls and sell their own products during Diwali and Christmas at "Oz Haat" carnival and other venues. This enhances their social skills.
3. Every Saturday students take part in various sports activities at American Embassy school along with the students of that school.
4. Every Sunday students go on educational tours and picnics to the Nehru planetarium, Lotus temple, Tughluqabad fort etc
5. Every week from Monday to Friday, volunteers from Lady Shri Ram college come to teach art and craft, current affairs, general awareness, safety measures, environmental issues, drama etc to the students.

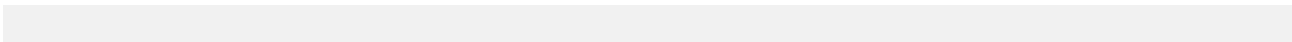

Tamana became the first Special Accredited Center (SAIED) Of National Open School in 1999. Non Tamana students also utilize this facility. Tamana has the accreditation to run the following programmes of NIOS :- Open Basic Education, secondary Education and Senior Secondary Education. NIOS programme at Tamana caters to differently abled, economically disadvantaged youth and school dropouts. Classes are conducting on every Saturday 9:00 am to 1:00 pm for non Tamana students.:

Our centre is also the examination centre of NIOS. NIOS conducts exam twice in a year i.e. March/April and October/November.



OUTREACH PROGRAM

Outreach programme can be availed by children who do not need to attend a special school but require supplemental tutoring or support in the form of therapies. There may be various other reasons like inaccessibility (location, personal reasons, timings etc) because of which a child cannot be enrolled in our regular programmes. To meet these needs and to ensure that every parent who comes to the Tamana gets some form of constructive help, Tamana set up outreach cell in its three centres which offer support to these children and adults. The outreach programme provides services through a highly qualified team of educators and therapists.

Additional Vocational Units

Sublimation UNIT:

At Tamana Skill Development Centre students are being trained on 3 Dimensional Sublimation printing techniques. The unit has been set up on the top floor at Nai Disha.

The Project aims at providing a platform based on innovative print technology to help stimulate self employment and a source of livelihood for our Students. At present 17students are being trained in this unit.

Terrace Kitchen Gardening

As part of the Eat Healthy Nutrition Education program, students of the Trainable group have been introduced to and taught the concept of growing vegetables and herbs. They are being trained in the process of seeds and saplings to full grown plant. With easy to follow guidelines, students learn more about the origins of vegetables. Vegetables such as tomato, eggplant, coriander, chilly, spinach, cluster beans, okra, lettuce etc are grown during summer while cabbage, cauliflower, fenugreek, radish, green peas, cowpea, carrot and gourd will be grown in winter.

Sun Drying of Herbs and Vegetables

The student was introduced to sun drying methods for a variety of herbs, greens and vegetables. Seasonal vegetables are sun dried which is an excellent way to preserve foods that increases the availability of foods all year round. Students sun dried and then packed dried herbs such as fresh methi from the herb garden. The steps involved in sun drying methods are easy to follow by our students. This activity has increased student's awareness and acceptance towards fruit and vegetables.

Healthy Canteen

As part of Healthy Eating initiative, we started Healthy canteen for the Students which is run by the Students. Standardized Recipes of healthy drinks and low fat snacks that are easy and simple to follow as well nutritionally healthy are being taught. We are training the students in practical and applied, emphasizing skills like sanitation, safe food handling and basic food preparation skills. It also motivates them to continue cooking at home under parents' supervision. A fixed 5 day menu is planned and revised every quarter.

Book Binding Unit

- Book Binding Unit was started in month of August 2015 at the demand of our beneficiaries and for consuming the waste products from file and other paper products unit of Nai Disha.
- 6 students are working at a time under supervision of one teacher/ instructor.
- Two out of six have all ready been trained in how to make spiral notepads and rest are semi trained and require more training and practice as per their limitations.

Weaving Unit:

- Weaving unit started in Feb-2016 at Nai Disha and School of Hope Autism Centre Tamana.

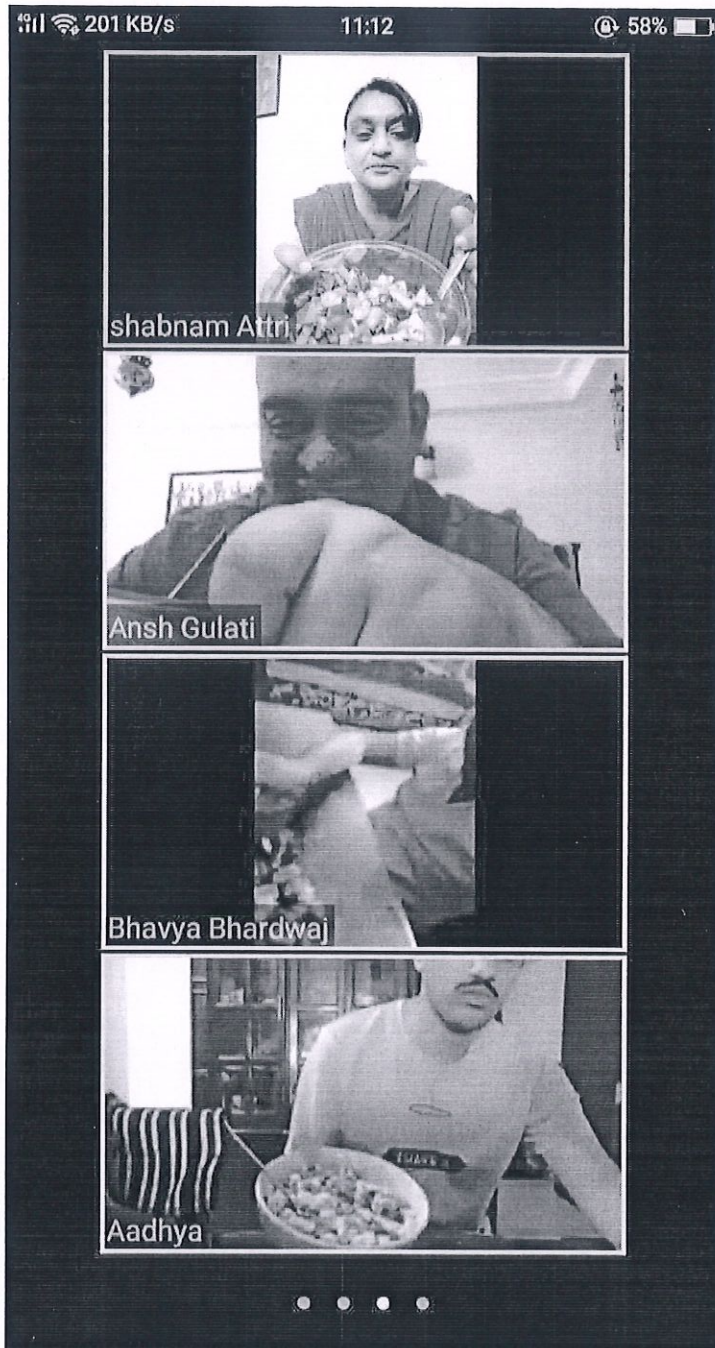

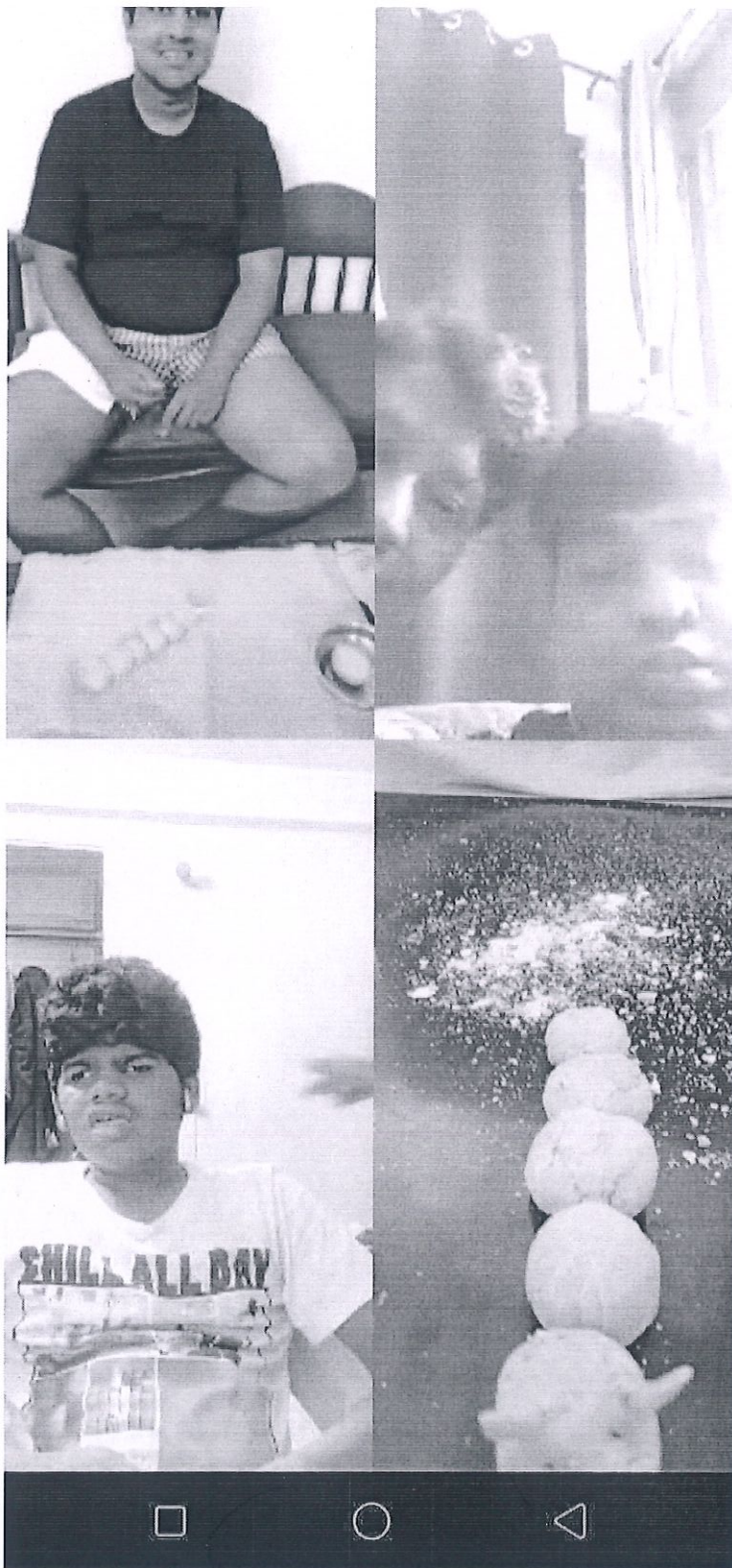

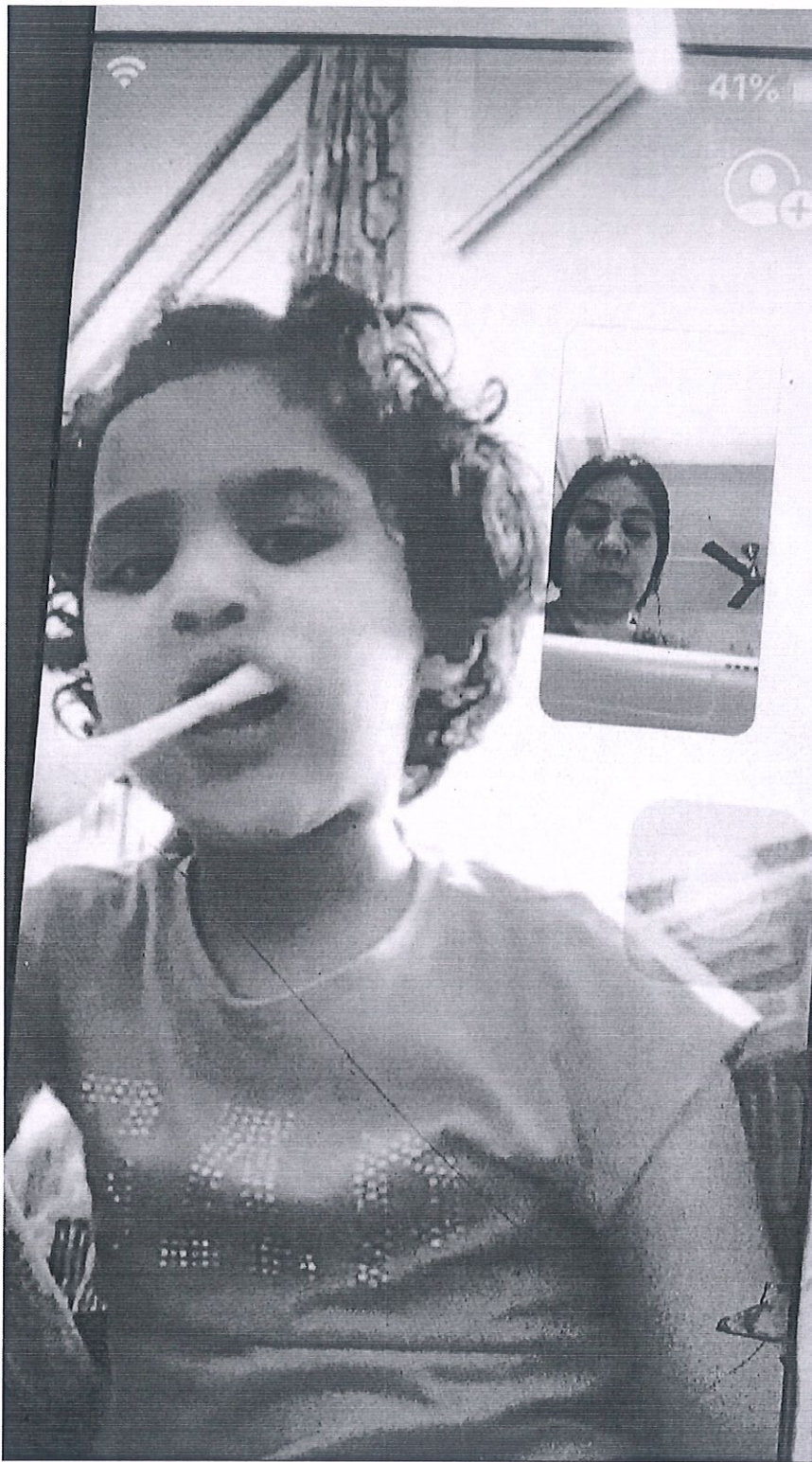
