
## **Annual Report**

2018-19



## Background:-

The Association of Parents of Special Adults is working for the benefit of the Special Adults. ADHAR has built two residential complexes towards fulfilling this objective.

It works in the spirit of Trusteeship and is managed by a Board of Trustees consisting 10 trustees of which 7 trustees are parents of mentally retarded children. At present we have 325 Special Adults (242 male & 83 female) under our care. Adhar is providing them with lifelong care, training and rehabilitation facilities with the help of Psychologist, Psychiatrist, Physiotherapist, Occupational Therapist, Medical Officers, Social Workers, Special Teachers, Care Takers and other Office Staff.

In the year 1990, around 25 parents of Special Adults children came together under the leadership of our Adhar's founder Late Shri M. G. Gore to find out a permanent solution for their constant worry of "After us what? Who will take care of our special children?" Thus Adhar Badlapur was born with the concept of a residential institution taking lifelong care and rehabilitation of Special Adults for the benefit of parents and their family.

Adhar does not receive any grant or aid from the Government. It runs on parents' contributions and donations. Since its inception, Adhar has been extending financial subsidy to the parents depending on their economic conditions. Currently (March 2018) the average age of the Special Adults is about 45 yrs and average age of parents is around 70 yrs, which means that the parents' contribution will reduce in future as they get older.

## Adhar is run transparently with all decisions being open to discussion with parents. Good governance and honesty are the key principles of managing Adhar

- 7 out of 10 members of the Governing Board of Trustees are parents of Special Adults. Thus our Adhar is Parents run, managed & funded Organisation.
- No bar on the basis of religion or caste.
- We give admissions to adults of all categories of mental retardation.
- Admissions are given strictly on first come first basis.
- There is a rule that parents who wish to admit their child at Adhar should first physically visit the residential complex and then take the decision of admission.
- Equal facilities and services to all residents. No discrimination on the basis of affluence of parents.

## Special concession in maintenance charges are given to parents facing financial difficulties.

- Every resident is happy and enjoys staying at Adhar. Many of our residents don't wish to go home even for a day.
- It gives us great pleasure when we see the parents relaxed and free from their worries when they see their children are very happy and comfortable at Adhar.
- It's our achievement that many parents are visiting Adhar regularly even though their son / daughter are no more.
- Parents / visitors can visit the campus any time without informing.
- The Trustees / Parents / staff / visitors are served the same food which is being prepared for the residents. All of them are paying for their meals at Adhar.
- Receipts are being issued immediately to the party.

# Adhar Silver Jubilee Symposium A PATH BREAKING EVENT

Silver Jubilee is a significant juncture in the life of an institution, more so in case of a non-profit, voluntary organisation like Adhar. It is a milestone, when we can look back, feel proud of our achievements and celebrate them. It is also a landmark point, from where we can strategize for the future. Therefore, we at Adhar have



organised a range of events during the year- some of them, savouring the milestone, and some, looking ahead at the next 25 years.

One such forward looking event was the Adhar Silver Jubilee Symposium, organised on December 5, 2018-commemorating the week of the International Disability day.

The theme of the symposium was "CSR for the specially abled – Ways to make it more meaningful". (CSR stands for Corporate Social Responsibility.)

The symposium had three objectives:

- To express our gratitude to Adhar's friends who have strongly supported us during the 25 year journey.
- To establish a thought leadership platformfor the specially abled – with special reference to intellectual disability.
- To increase Adhar's outreach, in India and overseas if possible, so that

we can get greater resources for building an even better future for our stakeholders.

We gave the event a corporate flavour, by organising it at the MCA Club, Bandra-Kurla Complex, Mumbai. The event was well attended by our target audience - friends of Adhar, both individual and corporate supporters and people who wanted to know more about Adhar.

The interesting mix of speakers at the Symposium gave us many points to ponder over and act.



- Ms. Shweta Shalini, Advisor to the Chief Minister, Maharashtra and Executive Director at Maharashtra Village Social Transformation Foundation, opened the deliberations with an inspiring speech on various issues about intellectual disability, social responsibility and government policies. She brought out the need and the opportunity to lobby for and get intellectual disability as a specific area for statutory CSR requirement.
- Mr. Prashant Joshi, Chief Operating and Risk Officer, IndoStar Capital Finance Limited shared his corporate perspective of CSR, how to focus on practical factors and the need for

- volunteering by corporate employees.
- Mr. Kaushik Datta, Programme Lead/ Specialist, National CSR Hub, TISS, brought out the research and academic angles in CSR as a career and enablers of social development.

The Chief Guest, Mr. Jonathan Hwang, Cultural Officer – US Consulate, Mumbai, spoke about the steps taken by the US government in the specially-abled people space. He also pointed out areas where Adhar can look to the US Consulate for guidance.

Mr. Milind Sarwate, Founder, Increate Social Value Advisors & Resourcers (ISVAR) anchored the proceedings and summed up the deliberations.

It was the first time that we had organised an event of this scale with multiple objectives. What made it a meaningful success was the dedicated hard work of



the three teams involved- Adhar, SocialKonnekt who master-minded the social media and event marketing, and ISVAR, who strategized and scripted the event.

The success of this event has enthused us to plan that every year, around the International Disability day, we will hold a similar thought leadership event!

During the discussion, the Consul General interacted with other delegates, and discussed ways and means to further strengthen the bilateral cooperation between the US Consulate Office in Mumbai & Adhar. A way forward plan, covering the political, economic, commercial, and domain knowledge exchanges was also discussed. In this manner, Mr. Edgard learnt about Adhar's role in this unique domain of Intellectual disability.
