2022 – 2023

Jeevoday Special School was established in the year 1989, as it was the need of the place. Jeevoday was started in a small building with 17 special youngsters and today the numbers was raised and above 300 special youngsters are getting training and education. Jeevoday Education Society, a special school for the Intellectually Challenged, has been in existence for 34 years in Nagpur. We have 50 competent staff teaching and non- teaching, each one is specially trained according to their responsibility and position.

Following the Disha Abhiyan, which focuses on developing a relevant educational curriculum for children with intellectual and developmental disabilities, we have been providing effective training to help our special youngsters become self-reliant and capable of independent living in their day-to-day lives.



Services Offered at Jeevoday

Early intervention, Individualized Education Programs (IEP), group teaching, academic skills, communication skills, life skills, environmental skills, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, speech therapy, music therapy, teaching for independence in mobility, and activities that enhance fine motor coordination, such as the Sticking Activity. Additionally, we offer counseling for parents and siblings, as well as yoga and physical exercise.

Prathiksha Rehabilitation Centre

The aim of Prathiksha is to provide adults with intellectually challenged an environment where they can learn skills, explore, enhance their abilities, and apply them to functional tasks while also supporting opportunities for livelihood.

Paper Bag Making

We have a paper bag manufacturing unit for young adults with intellectually challenged. Those who are above 18 years of age receive training in paper bag making, and some of them can efficiently produce paper bags under the supervision of trained vocational instructors. Our students are well-trained in this small industry and are receiving orders from various shops. Additionally, they are involved in candle making and phenyl production.



Sports

The school encourages students to participate in various district and state-level events. The school has been actively involved in athletics, cricket, and swimming competitions at different locations.

- ❖ Our student, Aman Kawale, secured a gold medal in swimming in Pune.
- ❖ One of our students, Anup Butoliya, won a gold medal in National-level table tennis, and we are pleased to announce that he has been selected to compete at the international level.



Events & Celebrations

Jeevoday Special School celebrated national festivals, including Independence Day, Diwali, Teachers' Day, Children's Day, Disability Day, Intellectually Challenged Day, and Christmas. During these events, the students engaged in various dances and activities. We also organized drawing and Rangoli competitions, and the winners' received prizes.

Moreover, both students and staff participated in a cultural event organized by the Social Welfare Office in Nagpur on the 3rd of December to commemorate Disability Day.



International Programme.

Our students competed in an international dance competition at Alpana Sambhav 2022 in New Delhi, which took place online. Drawing and dance competitions were also held at Shri Ramdeobaba College of Engineering and Management. Anamika and Shantanu Kawase, two of our students, achieved first place in the drawing competition as well as first place in the group dance competition.

Jeevoday promotes teaching and learning while providing ample opportunities for educators to attend various workshops to strengthen and enhance their teaching skills.

Workshops and Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) sessions are organized at Jeevodaya College by experts to impart knowledge and promote personality development. These events also offer evaluations for teachers and parents, enabling them to update their knowledge and skills.

This syllabus includes Specific Learning Disabilities and Autism Spectrum Disorder, reflecting our commitment to inclusive education. Our trainees have the opportunity to improve their skills in inclusive schools, remedial teaching, and special education.

Jeevoday College has a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with St. Vincent Palloti School in Anandh Nagar for trainees' teaching practices.

The 2021 batch of trainees has excelled, currently engaged in their internships at Palloti School, Jeevoday, and the Remedial Teaching Center. Meanwhile, the 2022 batch has successfully completed their first year and are now advancing to their second year of training.
