The Organization:

The Disable Rehabilitation & Charitable Trust (DRCT) started functioning from 8th January 2012 in a rented building at Bhaskarganj – A, Sahadevkhunta, Balasore.

At present (from 27 February of 2021) it is functioning at Bhaskarganj – B, Sahadevkhunta, Balasore-756001.

AIM:

DRCT aims at alleviating human suffering by providing physiotherapy, occupational therapy, prosthetics therapy, orthotics therapy and medical aid free of cost or at highly subsidized cost to the poor, downtrodden and disabled humanity who could not afford the costly treatment available at other private hospitals and rehabilitation centers so as to enable them to carry on their day to day activities and earn their bread and butter to live in the society with respect and dignity.

OBJECTIVES:

To help the physically, mentally and functionally affected people become self independent such as the ones with the following symptom by providing them with medical aids, prosthetics and orthotics, mobility aids, and above all to create awareness among the community.

- Intellectual Disability
- Cerebral Palsy
- Autism
- Mental Retardation
- Multiple Disability
- Specific Learning Disability
- Neurological Impairment
- Musculoskeletal disorder

MISSION / VISION:

To bring different health service facilities like physiotherapy, occupational therapy, prosthetic & orthotics, mobility aids, medical aids and other allied services to rehabilitate the

persons with disabilities and to change their life style as well as to build up the organization as a hub of excellence in the relevant field.

IMPLEMENTATION:

In Odisha, one Institute of Rehabilitation & Training managed by the Union Government namely S.V NIRTAR is situated at Olatpur, Cuttack which is near about 250k.m. from our city Balasore.

The PwIDs from Balasore do not have any rehabilitation service at their door step. In order to avail the service, they have to cover the whole distance from Balasore to Olatpur which is quite difficult & gruesome task for PwIDs. In order to facilitate availability of rehabilitation services like Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy and other allied services at the door step of the PWDs, we established a charitable setup of rehabilitation unit for them here at Balasore where we provide physiotherapy, occupational therapy, prosthetic & orthotics, mobility aids and medical aids to rehabilitate them and also to create awareness among the community about implementation of different schemes and programmed by our Government.

Project Area:

The jurisdiction of the organization is throughout the state.

Our Beneficiaries:

The organization provides service to mankind in all irrespective of caste, religion, race & sex etc.

Our Dependence:

The Organization depends upon its staff which is a well organized human force dedicated for the task with active trustee members.

ACTIVITIES IN DETAILES:

By this financial 2022-23 the Disable Rehabilitation & Charitable Trust (DRCT) continuously provides Therapeutic service to the PwIDs, Organizes Free Health Camp &



Health Awareness Camp for the PwIDs in our district Balasore by the support of professional qualified Physiotherapist, Occupational Therapist & Special Educator.



Basically we provide service to these categories of PwIDs like those with Intellectual Disabilities, Cerebral Palsy, Autism, Mental Retardation, Specific Learning Disability,



Multiple Disabilities, Neurological impairment, Musculoskeletal disorder, mobility aids, medical aids & by creating awareness among the community.



Out of the above categories of PwIDs, we give more focus on the ones with Intellectual Disabilities, Cerebral Palsy, Autism, Mental Retardation and Multiple Disabilities.

As providing such therapeutic services involves long term process, this F.Y. **2022-23** DRCT have provided **nearly 9210 number of** therapeutic service units (sessions) to the above categories of PwDs along with other allied services. Out of them, about **18 numbers of PwIDs have been able to return to the mainstream**. Because of the long term involvement, others are carrying-on the therapeutic services at the Organization's Rehabilitation Unit.
