COVID-19 WELFARE PROGRAMS 2021-2022 (2nd Wave)

The wide spread, pandemic COVID 19 outbreak affects all segments of population worldwide including in our working state, Tamilnadu has been drastically infected during mid of March 2020. It seriously affects all the nations, particularly detrimental social groups, includes people lives in poverty situations, elders, physically Handicapped (PH), visually Impaired (VI) and Children with Intellectual Disabilities, youth and indigenous people. The daily lifestyle is completely collapsed by Lockdown of over 12 month's period continuously. In the previous year we have supported the most disadvantaged PWDs in our working are for various welfare services and emergency relief assistances, As like as previous year, we have also conducted the following services for this COVID 19 Second Wave...

***** Groceries distribution:

In this program, by assisting voluntary that our ROYALVISION have provided the Differently abled affected victims of COVID 19 in our working area through Dry Rations Groceries, Face Mask, Hand Sanitizers etc., On 04.06.2021 to 27.06.2021 we have organised this program in in Royalvision Campus we have distributed the Groceries and Dry Ration materials pack to the most vulnerable Persons with Multiple Disabilities, Children with Intellectual disabilities from the Kaithari Nagar, (Nesevalar Kudiyiruppu – the Weavers Colony in Thiruparankundram Block).





This Groceries Pack includes the Dhall, Pulses, Cereals, Salk, Masala Powders etc., Over 40 differentlyabled are benefited by this program.

Food Distribution



As continuation of supporting the Differentlyabled welfare, and the COVID 19 Welfare assistances 2021 – 2022 (2nd Wave) our ROYALVISION has also conducted the Food Distribution to the differentlyabled in our working area. On 3.7.2021 we have conducted this program at MMC Colony, Thirunagar, Thiruparankundram, about 50 beneficiaries,

Awareness Program for PWDs 2nd Wave 17.07. 2021 at Royalvision Special School. The purpose of this program is: to create Awareness among public, vulnerable groups about spreading of noval Coronovirus, Importance of keeping social distancing, benefits of wearing Face masks and educated the people to strictly follow the rules and SOP of Govt of TN to combat the virus. Under the Financial support from Philanthropist donors, volunteer's team, we have distributed sanitary wears, Face masks to 50 participants were benefited by this program.

Vaccine Camp



A special Vaccine Camp was organised by ROYAL VISION in response to the COVID 19 period to support the poor and disadvantaged differently abled in our working area, we have organised the COVID 19 Vaccine Camp on 31.07. 2021 at our Royalvision Campus, about 30 participants were come and injected the COVAXIN

immunization, a Doctors team with staff nurses, volunteers and our Royalvision Staffs were managed and coordinated the program.

UDID Card Registration Camp

Central Government of India had recently implemented a special scheme for providing a UDID Card – which especially the Identity Card for the Persons with Disability. Through the I.D Card PWDs can access all kind of benefits from the government. To impart the awareness and facilitating this UDID Card scheme ROYALVISION organised a Two Camps by this 2021,

- 1. On **23.08.2021 to 03. 09. 2021** the Camp was organised at the TPK Taluk Office premises, and about 200 participants were benefited by this camp

As a special focuses on considering the importance of the scheme, that our staffs of ROYALVISION were made a direct home visit to distribute the cards to the doorsteps of the PWDs.






We have distributed this UDID Card to 200 PWDs in each of the camps, totally about 400 disabled were given by the UDID Card by this two camps. This program given an orientation on various benefits of Government Welfare schemes, need of community based care and supports, reservation of Rights based developments and redresses to the PWD etc.,

ROYALVISION SPECIAL SCHOOL Online Classes

ROYALVISION is focusing working on the welfare of the PWDs, and children with multiple disabilities. For achieving this, we have been running a "Special School for Children with Intellectual Disabilities" since 2012, which has been, offering productive rehabilitation services to the M.R children. Thus it is a milestone in the history of our organisation. This school has about 48 children aged from 5yrs to 16yrs with Intellectual Disabilities, Autism, Cerepal Palsy and multiple disabilities under the individual care and parental affection of a team of 5 Special Educators, 2 Care Takers and a Physiotherapist. The children are trained and encouraged to play and learn activities with a specially designed curriculum. Daily Yoga practice, speech therapy, dance therapy, skill enhancement classes, creative education classes, value education









Due to the COVID 19 pandemic widespread our School did not functioning during the reporting period 2021 – 2022 and we were conducted the Online classes regularly and our Special educators were go to home directly to support the students in this COVID 19 period. The Online Classes were regularly attended by the children..

Dress Distribution Program - 1

Every year Our ROYALVISION goes a long way in providing new dresses and sweets for the visually impaired and persons with differently abled ahead of the festive season. This year on 28.10.20210 a Free Dress Distribution ceremony was held at 12.00 PM in the Asal Malabar Beedi Mazhigai in Avaniapuram Madurai. About 200 persons with differently abled below the poverty line were identified and provided with free dresses, sweets and food. At the ceremony our Royalvision Special School children were also given free dresses.





The ceremony was held with Madurai District Wholesellers and Shop Merchants Society, Ganesha Stores, BRB Agency. Mr.K.Mohan Secretary of Madurai District Consumer goods wholesales Association presided over the function. Mr.S.R.Sambasivan, managing trustee Vedha agama Paripalana Trust attended as a special guest by lighting lamp. Mr.Gopal Chettiyar, Mr.Thiyagarajan Industrialist were chief guest, Ganesha store proprietor Mr.Ganeshan and Mr.Thirupathi raj attended and distributed new dresses to the disabled. Mr. M. Ulagasandron managing trustee ROYALVISION hosted the function.

Dress Distribution Program - 2

As a continuation of the Free Dress Distribution, an another one event was organised on 02.11.2021 at the Victoria Edward Hall Madurai. About 40 persons with differently abled below the poverty line were identified and provided with free dresses, sweets and food. At the ceremony our Royalvision Special School children were also given free dresses and cloth materials.





The ceremony was held with Chief guest Dr. I. Ismail Secretary to Victoria Edward Hall, distributed new dresses to the disabled. Mr. M. Ulagasandron managing trustee ROYALVISION hosted the function.

Marriage Assistance Scheme for Differently abled

As a new program initiative, our ROYALVISION has launched a Special Service program namely, Marriage Assistance Scheme for Differently abled by this reporting year 2021 – 2022, Under this scheme, we had planned to support the most deprived, disadvantaged Differently abled persons and do marriage assistance to lead their happy family life and supporting their rehabilitation also. By this year, on 11.02. 2022, we have conducted a grand Marriage Ceremony to Mr. Meenakshi with Mr. Palanisamy (both are visually impaired) at our Royavision Campus at where Mr. R. Sambhasivan Vedha Agama Paripalana Trust, and Mr. Parthiban Thalisdar TPK was presided over the function. Mr.R.Kannan – Secretary, Sarvodhya Sangam, Dr.K.Jeyakodi – SN College, Mr. K.Velu – Alumni of Thirupathur School for the Blind were facilitated the function.





The Marriage couples were supported by "Kalyana Seervarisai" – as set of utensils, and other necessary amenities, to run their happy family life. Our Royal Vision team of staffs were mobilised donations, gifts and kinds to support this marriage event. A grand food, lunch, refreshments were given to the participants – over 150 participants from PWDs, Vis were benefited and enjoyed the marriage function. Our ROYALVSION has also planned to continue the Marriage Assistance Scheme for the Differently abled by the upcoming years, through the support of donors, philanthropists and friends.

HOSTEL FOR THE PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

ROYALVISION established a special hostel facility to the school and college going visually impaired students at Perungudi, Madurai on 15th July 2007. About 11 visually impaired and 10 Intellectually Disabled students from in and around the district are accommodated in the hostel. The hostel offers good shelter with necessary facilities creating a congenial atmosphere for the visually impaired to stay peacefully and joyfully. Because of the COVID 19 pandemic, we have closed the Hostel for all the 12 months in this reporting year 2021 – 2022.

SPECIAL WELFARE PROGRAM FOR PERSONS WITH DIFFERENTLY ABLED

The Social service of ROYALVISION Trust does not end with the work of upliftment of the differently abled and visually impaired individuals. In fact it extends beyond that to take care of their families too. A survey of their families was first made to recognize and identify the ROYAL VISION, Madurai Dist. TN

BPL families among them. The families with more than one differently abled person are identified. Finally the families with less than a monthly income of Rs.5000/- are short listed from among which 50 families are finally selected to be helped. Such a social welfare scheme has been conducted by Royalvision for the past Five years. All the chosen families are freely provided with the necessary and grocery items every month.







This year we have conducted this Program on every month 4th saturday. During festive occasions the differently abled are provided with new dresses. The visually impaired in those families are given the white cane free of cost every year on the white cane day. This program was fully sponsored as financially by Vedha Agama Paripalana Trust, an NGO functioning @ Madurai.

6th Year Inauguration day of SWP Program



The Vedha Agama Paripalana Trust – Madurai is an pioneer donor organisation to our ROYALVISION, and this VAP Trust has been supported our Differentlyabled beneficiaries with the Dry Rations – and other materials for their daily needs. This is the 6th Year of Inaugural Ceremony of this program conducted by 26.02. 2022 at Royalvision Campus. We

have conducted a special event at where Mr. S.R. Sambasivam, Managing Trustee of Vedha Agama Paripalana Trust and Mr. Ulagasandron – Managing Trustee, ROYALVISION gave the special speech and thanks to the donor organisation for their continual support and services for carrying this SWPD.

Over 50 more disabled, PWDs and Children with Intellectual disabilities from the ROYALVISION School were participated and benefited in this program.

LOCAL LEVEL COMMITTEE & LEGAL GUARDIANSHIP

The National Trust Act 1999 is promoted the Local Level Committee for the welfare and support of the PWDs, this Committee is chaired by the District Collector and additional of 3 members. Our ROYALVISION trust is functioning as a local body membership of this committee and as a Legal Guardianships for protecting the welfare of the Intellectual

disabilities, Autism, Cerebral Palsy and Persons with Multiple disorders facilitating the legal provided benefits rendered by the various Govt welfare schemes etc.,





The applications received by theses PWDS through Online has been verified by our staffs team directly and submitted the report to District Collector for providing Guardianship Certificates to the eligible candidates.

AUDIO LIBRARY

For enhancing the skill based development and to adopt quality lifestyle of V.Is, ROYALVISION had established a special Audio Library in Madurai in 2012. This special Audio Library has more than 1000 CDs of audios in Tamil & English related to Education, G.K, Politics, Social, Nature & Environment, and Entertainment. The visually impaired from our hostel and also of other parts of the district make use of our library materials and enjoy the benefits of Audio Library. Because of COVID 19 pandemic, we have closed the Audio Library for all the 12 months in this reporting year 2021 - 2022.
