SRI MAHATMA NURSERY AND PRIMARY SCHOOL



Sri Mahatma Nursery and Primary School was started on 2000 with 17 Students and 3 Teachers.

Now 2023-2024 school have 111 Students with 8 Teachers and 2 Helpers are currently working for the children.

Our school has been duly registered under Education Department with registration number 3511-2001 till date duly updated and following all the rules and the norms notified by the Government.

Our school completed all the work said by Chief Education Office & District Education Office regarding EMIS online portal in stipulated time. This year we admit 8 children in 25% RTE for the class LKG and upload in EMIS online portal also.

The commencement of the academic year 2023-24 began on 12.06.2023 by warmly welcoming the old students and newly joint students to the school.

In the academic year 2023-24, Yoga Day, Education Day, Independence Day,

Teacher's Day, International Writing Day, Saraswathi Pooja, Children's Day, Christmas Day, Pongal Festival Day and Republic Day were celebrated by inviting special guests.

On 02.08.2022, painting, essay competition and handwriting competition were conducted for children on the occasion of Independence Day.

Parent teacher meeting was held on 11.08.2022 and 12.08.2022 to discuss the progress of children, teacher training and school progress.

Children were taken to Rameswaram and Dhanushkodi on 28.08.2022 for one day tour to get details about educational and other public places and also to Keezadi and Madurai on 30.03.2022.

To realize the importance of trees, school teachers, parents and children participated in a tree planting ceremony called Panchavadi on 17.01.2022.

On 02.03.2024 the 24rd anniversary of our school was celebrated.















NAMBIKKAI SPEICAL SCHOOL FOR INTELLECTUALLY DISABLED



Nambikkai Residential Special School for Intellectually Disabled was started on 2002 with 7 Students and 2 Special Teachers.

Now 2023-2024 school have 53 Students with 3 Special Teachers, 1 Physiotherapy, 1 Yoga Master, 1 Nurse, 1 Part Time Doctor and 3 Helpers are currently working for the Intellectually Disabled Children. The School was registered under State Government.

In the academic year 2023-24, Kakkan's Birthday, Yoga Day, Bakrith Day, Swamy Vivekananda's Birthday, Education Day, Moharam Day, Abdul Kalam's Memorial Day, Independence Day, Saraswathi Pooja, Deepavali Festival, Children's Day, Disability Day, World Disability Day, Christmas Day, Pongal Festival and Republic Day were celebrated by inviting special guests.

On 21.06.2023 District Collector inspect our school and give wishes to all the students and congrats all teaching and non teaching staffs and purchase the ornaments made by intellectually diabled

students.

Parent teacher meeting was held on 20.06.2023, 12.09.2023, 19.12.2023 and 05.03.2024 to discuss the progress of children, teacher training and school progress.

On 20.12.2023, our school staffs participated in Makkaludan Muthalvar Camp on behalf of DDAWO and get petition from disabilities.

On 02.02.2024, the students of our school participated in a dance performance and received certificates in a grand book fair held in Sivagangai.

Children, Parents and Teachers were taken to Keeladi and Madurai on 31.03.2023 for one day excursion

On 03.05.2024, 22nd Anniversary of our school was celebrated. DDAWO and DSWO were graced the occasion as the Special Guest.

Under the RBSK scheme we are very careful about the health of children by conducting medical check-up once a month from Keelapungudi PH Centre.

NATIONAL TRUST OCAL LEVEL COMMITTEE

NAMBIKKAI OLD AGE HOME

Our Society was registered under the National Trust and become Local the Senior Citizen Act on 04.10.2019. Level Committee Member from 07-06-2019. District Collector the chairperson for Local Level Committee. **Totally 440 Intellectually Disabled adults** got their Legal Guardianship Certificate through National Trust and 4 Mentally Ill person's guardian get Guardianship Certificate.

A meeting will be held once in three months under the District Collector chairperson of the local level committee and a quarterly meeting will be held regarding LLC functioning and guardianship certificate.

Our Society was registered under Nambikkai Old Age Home for Old Age Persons was started with free of cost on Jun-2019 with 5 old aged persons. We 5 staffs for the engaged smooth administration of Nambikkai old age home. Currently 7 male and 23 female staying in above said old age home.

Although a proposal has been sent to the state government since 2019 seeking government funding for the old age home, the old age home has not received any government funding till now. Proposal submitted to District Social Welfare Office to register our organization for grant in aid for the vear 2023-24.











CMCHISTN AUTISM CENTER

The Chief Minister Comprehensive Health **Insurance** Scheme (CMCHIS) was started on 2018. In that scheme Special Coaching and Treatment was given to the Special Children like Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mentally Retarded and **Multiple** Disablity. 11 Special Children was benefited under this scheme.

TYPES OF DISABILITY WE SERVE

AUTISM:

There are 43 Autism Children in Nambikkai Early Intervention Centre for Intellectually Disabled and 11 Autism Students in Nambikkai Special School for Intellectually Diabled.

CEREBRAL PALSY:

There are 20 Children in Nambikkai Centre Early Intervention for Intellectually Disabled, 12 Students in Nambikkai Special School for **Intellectually Diabled and 8 persons in** Nambikkai Adult Home for Intellectually Disabled.

They were train-up by giving

Physiotherapy, Speech therapy, Occupational Therapy and Cognitions Development and use Caliber, CP Chair, Wheel Chair, Standing Chair and Corner Chair for their motor development.

MULTIPLE DISABILITIES:

There are 18 Children in Nambikkai Early Intervention Centre for Intellectually Disabled, 11 Students in Nambikkai Special School for Intellectually Diabled and 7 persons in Nambikkai Adult Home for Intellectually Disabled.

INTELLECTULLY DISABLED:

There are 58 Children in Nambikkai Early Intervention Centre for Intellectually Disabled, 30 Students in Nambikkai Special School for Intellectually Diabled and 28 persons in Nambikkai Adult Home for Intellectually Disabled.

HEARING IMPAIRED:

There are 22 Children in Nambikkai Early Intervention Centre for Hearing Impaired.













ENVIRONMENT AND AWARENESS

The people in general and the rural people in particular are under the shackles of illiteracy, ignorance with superstitious practices. Specifically the women are under male domination, atrocities and violence's. They could not enjoy their social respect, social justice and equity in society.

They are not allowed to take part at all level of decision making at home, village and in society. In order to retrieve those impoverished, vulnerable sectors from the glory life and deterioration trends we have organized the following awareness program at various places in Sivagangai District of Tamil Nadu.

- 1. Covid-19 Awareness camps.
- 2. Awareness and counselling to the mentally retarded persons.
- 3. Human rights Awareness.
- 4. Women rights Awareness.
- 5. Consumer Awareness.
- 6. Education Awareness.
- 7. Road Safety Awareness.
- 8. Personal and Hygienic Healthy Life Awareness.
- 9. Solid Waste Management.
- 10. Herbal Plantation.
- 11. Environmental Awareness

SKILL TRAINING:

The rural women depend upon the seasonal job of agriculture coolie works. Upon completion of the said coolie works they sat idle at the home without any source of alternative jobs for their livelihood. In the mean time they struggle lot and leading a life of hand to mouth existence.

So to avail them the self employment opportunities and income generative ventures we imparted skill trainings in tailoring, embroider, needle works, wire bag knitting, etc.,

HEALTH CAMP:

The rural people do not pay attention for their health care. Instead they took the traditional medicines and superstitious practices for their healings and treatments. Due to which some occasion they sustain to serious condition. So we conducted the health camp in our area of operation to streets and aware the importance of good healthy life in our area of operation. The medical expert was invited to examine the participants and provided drugs, medicines and tablets.

ENVIRONMENT AND AWARENESS

WELFARE ACTIVITES:

We have carried out various welfare activities for the disabled persons, women in distress and destitute, widows and their children. The below stipulated are the main welfare activities carried out during the year 2022 – 2023.

- 1. Women Awareness.
- 2. UDID Identity cards for Disabled Persons.
- 3. Distribution of black optical, brandy watches, walking sticks, hearing aids.
- 4. Arrangement of educational scholarships.
- 5. Assistants for maintaining the training goods.
- 6. Obtaining the transport concession cares to the disable persons.
- 7. Obtaining of railway concession to the disable persons.
- 8. Online apply for Disabled portal.
- 9. Extended help to the windows and old age persons to avail the pensions and other Government benefits.
