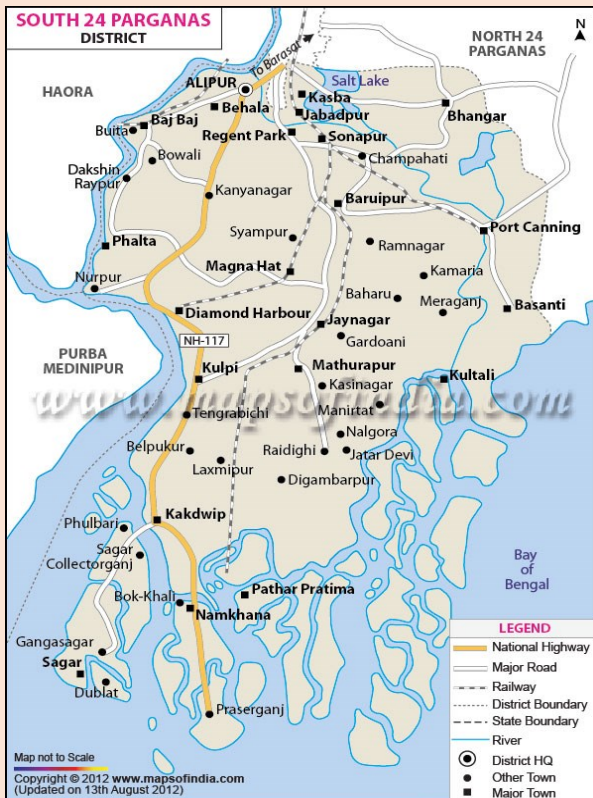

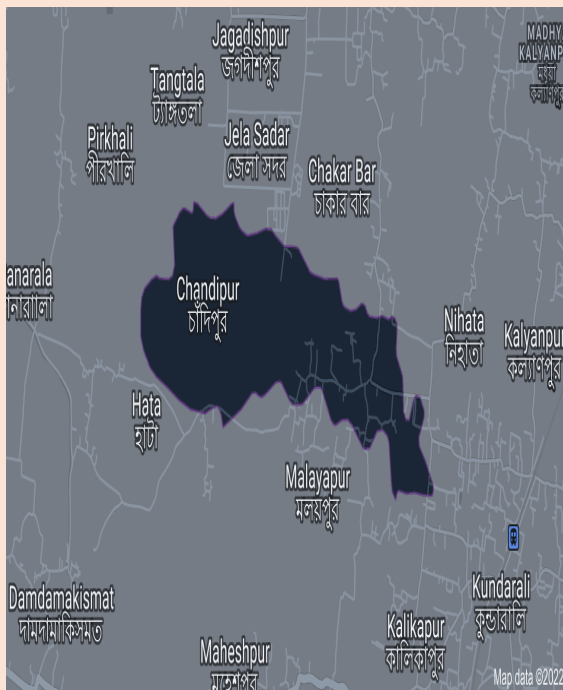

Besides, the organization is keeping touch with technical experts for quality development and resource mobilization for fulfilling its objectives.

Preface

Pirkhali Pathikrit was the consequence of hard labour, the consequence of dedication and the consequence of collective efforts; the local need accelerated the youth group to form an NGO in an unreached village of South 24 parganas district where the people were completely detached from the modern scientific & technological advancement of the global community. It was started in the form of a coaching /education centre in Chandipur village of Baruipur Sub-Division, South 24 Parganas district way back in 1999. Now, the organization has emerged as a nodal agency of human resource development in the district.

Pirkhali Pathikrit has been primarily working with special children since its inception. It takes care of their education, recreation, health & Nutrition in one hand and age appropriate & need based therapy, counselling etc on the other hand. Besides, the organization runs Training Collage for special educators and organizes skill & technical training programme.

This year the organization has completed 20 years of its services to the poor people including marginalized sections of the society, people with disabilities, old aged, women groups, unemployed youth, under 5 children, adolescent girls.

Pirkhali Pathikrit reached more than one lakh population in last 20 years. The history of 20 years is a history of commitment to people, the history of dedication of the organizers & staff, the history of participation & co-operation from all level of understanding including Government agencies, corporates, privet donors, donors based in abroad, beneficiaries, local self -governments, local institutions etc. The interventions like development for young children, activities for special children & youth, livelihoods & economic enhancement for poor, disaster response, skill & vocational training, and establishment of D. N. Mondal Collage for special educators would not be materialized without support from them.

Pirkhali Pathikrit works within the scope of the State as well as National Agenda, in particular in such areas as: development of Young children and Special Children, health, education, technical training , Human Resource Development Gender equality, Reduction of inequalities, Peace and justice, and partnerships for our goals.

ACTIVITIES 2021-2022

A. Disha Pratibandhi School

Pirkhali Pathikrit initiated an integrated programme in the name of **Disha Pratibandhi School** in 2007 for special children that fully equipped with the Pre-school and School session, Education and Training for all kinds of children with Behaviour Problems, Children with Multiple Disabilities, Autism, etc. and organizing Extra Curricular Activities, like Yoga, Dance, Music, Arts-N-Crafts, etc. for the same.

The team of specialists attending the Assessment and Counselling Unit of "MOTHER AND CHILD", consists of Psychiatrists, Psychologists, Special Educators, Qualified Academic Teachers, Speech and Occupational Therapists, etc. Besides this the Child Specialists, Orthodontists, ENT & Neuropsychiatrist, regularly visit the institute. The Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) (Ministry of Social Empowerment and Justice) recognizes all our Special Educators

Last year there were 172 children with special need were being engaged in different activities.

Different kind of therapeutic interventions were carried out in a periodic manner after setting the quarterly goal and monitored the same of those children to set a new goal or continue the same. Therapies included Physiotherapy, Speech Therapy, Music Therapy, Yoga Therapy and Special Education services. Implementation of Behavior Modification and other psychological principles were streamlined by a group of interdisciplinary professionals who has given their dedicated and sincere efforts to the students and parents on periodical basis.



It also act as an exclusive institute trying its best through its different activities like early identification in other Blocks of neighboring areas, awareness campaign programme in the rural areas to educate community and the parents to combat the menace as well as to tie up those children with the comprehensive Education with the help of multi-disciplinary professionals.

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B. Teachers Training Collage

Pirkhali Pathikrit is running the Teachers Training Programme for Special educators who work with students who have a wide range of learning, mental, emotional, and physical disabilities. They adapt general education lessons and teach various subjects, such as reading, writing, and math, to students with mild and moderate disabilities. Special education (also known as special-needs education, aided education, exceptional education, special ed. or SPED) is the practice of educating students in a way that addresses their individual differences and special needs. Ideally, this process involves the individually planned and systematically monitored arrangement of teaching procedures, adapted equipment and materials, and accessible settings. These interventions are designed to help individuals with special needs achieve a higher level of personal self-sufficiency and success in school and in their community which may not be available if the student were only given access to a typical classroom education.



It is worthy to be mentioned that Debendranath Mondal (D. N. Mondal) College is the recognized teacher training institute recognized by Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI), the statutory body under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities. **Following courses were running last year:**

1. B.ED. Spl.Ed.(MR)- Mental Retardation
2. D.Ed.Spl.Ed (IDD)- Intellectual Development Disability
3. Diploma in Education in Spl.Ed.(Hearing Impairment) D.Ed.SE (HI)

On completion of the course, the trainee teacher are being eligible for jobs like Special educator in special school, Special educator in inclusive set –up/regular school, Special educator in a clinical / hospital set-up, Special educator in Govt. Schools under the SSA/DSSSB programme, regular teacher and or trainee teacher to work in the home based training or also can open his or her own center. In the year 2020 -2 total students were 90 out of which 80% of students score more than 80%. In last 5 years 50% of the students have been engage in job in special schools and other voluntary organizations and are doing excellent work

The programme intends to educate and train the aspirants to become agents of change as teaching-professionals by imbibing the required knowledge, skills and positive attitude. The education and training will enable them to seek out and sharpen the talents in the children with disability. It will also catalyse the realization that special education is all about child centric good quality education. The course gave special preference to those from rural backgrounds and from economically weaker sections of society.

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In addition, to college it runs **two other courses and they are** follows:

- **Continuing Rehabilitation Education** – This is an important aspect of Rehabilitation Council of India to update the knowledge and skills of the professionals so as to provide quality services to the people with disabilities. This aspect is carried out through workshops, seminars, short-term refresher courses, orientation programs which are supported by RCI. Associations/ Institutions from Govt. / Non Govt. organizations are supported to conduct programmes for the benefit of professionals. RCI has been working with commitment to improve the standards of education of and training in the field of rehabilitation. Last year there were 3 batches with 30 in each batch.

- **NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF OPEN SCHOOLING**- last year 109 students completed 2 year D.El. Ed and 94 completed 6 months D.El. Ed bridge course

C. CRECHE PROGRAMME

Pirkhali Pathikrit is running 5 crèches and those are as follows:

1 UNIT 1 - Chandipur 27 : 2 UNIT 2 - Chakraberia 27 : 3 UNIT 3 - Malayapur 26

4 UNIT 4- Nihata 26 :5 State Creche 30



The programme objectives are:

1. To provide day-care facilities for children (6 months to 6 years) of working mothers in the community.
2. To improve nutrition and health status of children.
3. To promote physical, cognitive, social and emotional development (Holistic Development) of children.
4. To educate and empower parents /caregivers for better childcare.

The scheme provides an integrated package of the following services:

- (i) Daycare Facilities including Sleeping Facilities.
- (ii) Early Stimulation for children below 3 years and Pre-school Education for 3 to 6 years old children.
- (ii) Supplementary Nutrition (iv) Growth

Last year all the programme components were done as per the schedule and those are:

- Imparting training to crèche workers-
- Organized pre-school education activities for all targeted children.
- Organized stimulation activities for children below three year.
- Prepared a significant number of low -cost teaching learning material.
- Prepared nutritious food for children attending the crèche centre.
- Motivate more than 60% parents for immunization and obtain assistance of health staff in insuring immunization of children.
