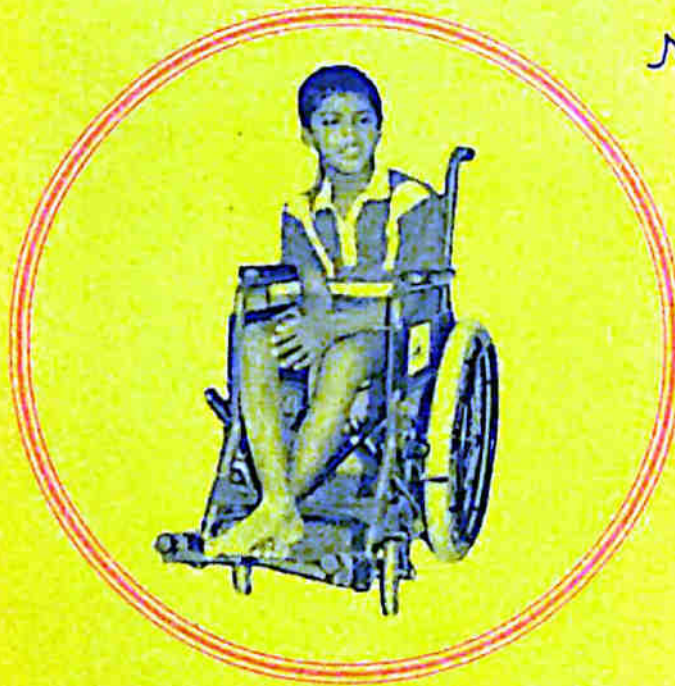

FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK:

My heartily greetings and best wish for all of you on behalf of Rampurhat Spastics & Handicapped Society. Before I deliver my speech I want to inform, you that the World is going through the international crisis: COVID-19. I am anxious to report that the COVID-19 situation has put us in a lot of troubles. We lost our beloved President and Vice-President of our Society in COVID-19 period. Society has lost its normal rhythm and all kinds of development work have stopped. The work of our organization has to be done differently. The type of self-employment has changed. We planned to do small business with Gharaunda residents at home.

The COVID-19 situation has been a major obstacle to the implementation of these plans. Rampurhat Spastics & Handicapped Society has been working with children with disabilities and PWDS in this pandemic situation in compliance with the government rules. We have to prepare our mental morale against this virus. Hope we should overcome the problem shortly. It is my great privilege that again I get the opportunity to write for all of you. In 1995 we started our journey to reach the unreached with some generous people around us. I hope a few and today many people join with us as a member of our society. We are happy to present the Annual Report of 2020-21 before the members. In the year 1995 Rampurhat Spastics and Handicapped Society was registered as grass root level voluntary organization under the West Bengal Society Registration Act, 1961 for providing services to the persons with disabilities. Since twenty six year's this organization has been gathered a lot of experience. **Disability is not a Disease; it cannot be cured by treatment or medicine.** It is a type of physical and mental condition and it gives lifelong disadvantages. We think that every person with disabilities must have talent and power to work though it is very limited. The persons with disability face some problems in doing work but they are not incapable and incompetent at all. In spite of their limited talent and power to work they can be made talented and useful by giving them proper training, love, affection and encouragement. Keeping this view in mind Rampurhat Spastics and Handicapped Society is providing different types of services to the persons with disabilities of Birbhum district. The persons with disabilities and the

Parents of the disabled children started to change their negative attitude. From our practical experience we realize that more disadvantages is the negative attitude of the people of our society towards the persons with disability than their physical and mental barriers. Our organization is trying to change the attitude of the people of our society through Awareness Camp, Seminar, different Workshops, and World Disabled Day celebration since its inception. Our society provides services to the persons with disability from the depth of the heart and made an example. As a result, in the year 2003-2004, we got National Award for the "Best Residential Care Centre". It is an inspiration before the organization. Each and every person of our society would accept that persons with disabilities are inseparable parts of our society. They would realize that the persons with disabilities are also human beings; they have right to live like other persons with full of dignity and honour. They are the part and parcel of our society and family; they are our relatives. We have to think that if we were handicapped in the course of time then we realized that it is not a sin; it is not a diseases. So we have to take it as disability is our social problems. We trust that in the near future all can unhesitatingly say that the traditional adverse mentality has been changed and the society is now composed of barrier free environment and the persons with disability will get social status. We acknowledge with gratitude the financial and technical assistance and cooperation extended by our donors, well-wishers, partners, Government and Non- Government agencies.

I would like to express my heartfelt appreciation to our governing body members for their guidance and support in each step. I am always thankful to all our staffs and beneficiaries for their dedication, motivation, knowledge skills and positive attitude which always enable us to go ahead.



BACKGROUND OF THE ORGANIZATION:

Rampurhat Spastics and Handicapped Societ established on 1995. It was initiated by Mr. Nurul Islam from the feeling of a father of a child with severely mentally challenged and a child specialist as well as social worker Dr. Monoranjan Sarkar being inspired by IICP, with the help of some parents and some well meaning people of our locality formed this Organization. It was started with the aim of providing physical management, basic education, treatment and rehabilitation to the children with special needs. At the initial stage we used to provide OPD and Home visit services one day in a week. Special school and vocational Unit were inaugurated on 26th July, 1999. At the same time a Residential care centre was started on the experimental basis with four beneficiaries. From the beginning we depended on public donation. National Trust sponsored our Residential Home for 20 beneficiaries from 16th April, 2002 to 31st March, 2005 under Reach & Relief scheme. Then it is again sanctioned from 1st April, 2005 for nine years under the scheme "SAMARTH". Wealso started "GHARAUNDA" scheme under National Trust from 1st April, 2016. In the financial year 2006-07, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment sponsored a Special School for 39 beneficiaries from 1st June, 2006 under DEENDAYAL Rehabilitation Scheme. Then we provided these services on an average 60 beneficiaries respectively. In the year 2017-18 we provided services to 10 beneficiaries in our own fund. Birbhum Child Line Rampurhat Sub-centre started its journey on 26th March' 2013, runs under Rampurhat Spastics and Handicappede Society.

In the year 2018-2019 we started CNCP(CWSN)BOYS' HOME sponsored by State Govt. & Central Government.

The organizations provided services to the persons with disability with

great sincerity and responsibilities. As a result, in the year 2003-2004, The national Trust of India gave National Award for the "Best Residential Care Centre" and The national Trust gave a National Award to the secretary as a Best Parent in the year 2008-09. In 2009-10, the National Trust awarded our institute as "Best Shelter Workshop" and "Best Emerging Venture" in 2010-11 and the West Bengal Government gave recognition to our organization as the "Best Institute" in the same year. Now the organization has been reached at a significant place.

OUR AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:

- ❶ To provide permanent care for abandoned and destitute persons with disabilities.
- ❷ To provide services to persons with disability whose family members are willing to pay for good quality services.
- ❸ To provide services to young persons with disability who need to stay in group homes and independent living situations.
- ❹ To create opportunities for family members to get respite time in order to fulfill other responsibilities.
- ❺ To provide services to senior citizens with disability.
- ❻ To provide early intervention, education and independent or employment oriented training.
- ❼ To provide rehabilitation & relief to persons with disability whose families are unable or unwilling to support them any longer.
- ❽ To provide man power development training.
- ❾ To provide parents awareness training.
- ❿ To empower the persons with disability so that they can live in their family and in the Community.
- ⓫ To aware persons with disability about their rights and equal opportunities.

- ④ To merge the persons with disability into the mainstream of the Society.
- ④ To make the persons with disability Socio-economically independent.
- ④ To Support the parents and families of persons with disability in different ways.
- ④ To develop the staff of our organization by giving proper training.
- ④ To create the awareness against child labour, child marriage and Child Lost.
- ④ To provide services to missing child for restoration.

Types of Services:

At present there are three projects are smoothly running under Rampurhat Spastics and Handicapped Society. These are:

- 1) GAHARUNDA Scheme. Sponsor by The National Trust.
- 2) CNCP(CWSN)BOYS' HOME. Sponsor by Central Govt. of India & State Govt. of West Bengal
- 3) Child Line. Sponsor by Child Line India Foundation.



RESIDENTIAL CARE CENTRE ("GAHARUNDA" Centre):

"After my death or in my illness who will take care of my child?" From this concept a parent of a child with multiple disability started this prolong care service centre named "ASHIRBAD RELIEF INSTITUTE" to the four persons with disabilities at initial stage in the year of 1999.

ASHIRBAD RELIEF INSTITUTE is a residential Home for persons with disability. In this unit we provide services to person with CP, MR, MD & Autism. We started this unit with four children at initial stage in the year 1999 and the numbers of beneficiaries have been increasing gradually. This unit was sponsored by "The National Trust" from 16th April, 2002 to 31st March, 2005 for twenty beneficiaries under the "Reach and Relief Scheme". In this period we received "National Award" from the National Trust (Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment) for the "Best Residential Care Centre" for the year 2003-2004 which is a great inspiration before the Organization." The National Trust awarded to the secretary as "Best parent" for the year 2008-09.

The National trust has sanctioned new revised 'GHARAUNDA Scheme' in the year 2016-17. We started the programme form April, 2016 with twenty beneficiaries. The category wise beneficiaries are BPL=11, Abandoned= 2, LIG= 2 & Non-LIG= 5 (2018-19). At present there are 20 beneficiaries in the GHARAUNDA Scheme of our Society. Out of 20 beneficiaries 5 beneficiaries are female and rest 15 beneficiaries are male.

The staff of the unit is comprises of qualified activity professional, physiotherapist, trained caregivers, and a part time medical doctor. There are 10 (Ten) staffs in our GHARAUNDA Scheme. All the staff has been sincerely providing services to the beneficiaries. We always try to

develop each beneficiary using his or her residual strength. We give priority to increase their ability and self esteem to live independently as much as possible. We do stress on their abilities by assessing their level of strength on all developmental areas and evaluate their abilities at the interval of every six months.

To maintain and develop in physical area we provide physiotherapy and physical exercise services. All the children are participated in vocational training session regularly.

Present Situation of HGARAUNDA Scheme:

At present there are 20 beneficiaries in the GHARAUNDA Scheme of our society. Out of 20 beneficiaries 15 beneficiaries came from SAMARTH Scheme on 01.04.2016 and the other 5 (five) beneficiaries come from C.R.T. on 01.10.2020. At the beginning of the GHARAUNDA Scheme all the beneficiaries were under prevocational training. Now all the beneficiaries of the GHARAUNDA Scheme able to perform household activities and other vocational work almost independently through special training.

In the financial year 2020-2021 there was 20 beneficiaries at the beginning of the year i.e. 1st April, 2020. But in the month of September, 2020 5 (five) beneficiaries had been rehabilitated in their family. Sumana Bhattacharya was rehabilitated on 15th September and other 4(four) beneficiaries: 1. Abhisek Das 2. Enayet Moola 3. Abhijit Let 4. Shamoli Dutta were rehabilitated on 30th September, 2020. While 5 (five) beneficiaries sent by C.R.T. on 1st October, 2020 to our GHARAUNDA Scheme. Therefore roll strength of the beneficiaries in our GHARAUNDA Scheme remain constant 20.

Considering the vocational skill such as personal, communicational, functional, academic, domestic and occupational we assess the ability of the beneficiaries and engage them according to abilities. The 20 beneficiaries are physically and functionally assessed and out of 20 beneficiaries 5 (five) beneficiaries are MR (MD) considered in Care Group and they are kept under self-care. The name of the 5 (five) beneficiaries are furnished below:

1. NURUZAMAN
2. ARINDA BHATTACHARJEE
3. ANANDA
4. ANIMESH DUTTA
5. DEBASISH DAS

Out of the above five beneficiaries Nuruzaman and Arinda Bhattacharjee completely dependent on Ayah they are not able to do their daily living activities independently. Other three beneficiaries have made to do their some personal and daily living activities through the oral direction.

Other 15 (Fifteen) beneficiaries can do household activities and take part in vocational activities. Out of 15 beneficiaries 5(Five) beneficiaries had acquired special experience in the field of vocational works. The performance of the above 5(five) beneficiaries have been discussed below:

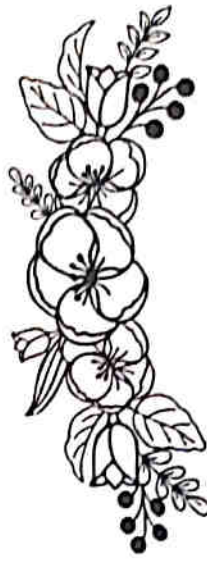
1. **Kajal Dhibar:** Kajal Dhibar is 29 years old now. He is a Moderate Mental Retarded (75%) man. He had some behavioral problem when he came under the GHARANDA Scheme. He was extremely angry and he had a tendency to commit suicide. Besides this he strikes his head against wall. We are able to decrease his behavioral problems through special training. He takes part in gardening, phenyls making, cooking. At present he had made expert in these field through special training. He may be rehabilitate on the basis of his above experience in future.



2. **Helarish Hansda:** Helarish Hansda is 24 years old now. He is a Mental Retarded (80%) boy. He was physically and mentally very weak when he came under the GHARAUNDA Scheme. He could not stand up on his feet. He crawled like a babe. Besides this he was very aggressive in nature. In short, his mental development was irregular. After special training he can do his daily living activities independently now. The smart mobile and computer operating have been taught him through special training. He may be rehabilitate in a computer centre or in a Mobile Ship business in future.



3. **Salamat Sekh:** Salamat Sekh is 26 years old now. He is a Moderate Mental Retarded (50%) boy. He was physically very weak and he had some problem of moving and walking. Besides this he was absolutely absent minded also. His moving and walking problem has been almost solved through physiotherapy. We also able to improve his social, academic and vocational skill also. He may be rehabilitate on the basis of his above experience in future.



4. **Margia Khatun:** Margia Khatun is 23 years old now. She is a Moderate Mental Retarded (70%) girl. She had some physical problem. She could not move and walk and catch anything in her hands properly. Her above problems has been almost cure through regular physiotherapy. Now she takes part in household activities, helping in cooking etc. she does successfully through vocational training. She may be rehabilitate on the basis of her above experience in future.



5. **Madhabi Konai:** Madhabi Konai is 28 years old now. She is a Moderate Mental Retarded (75%) girl. She had some behavioral problem when she came under the GHARANDA Scheme. She had low I.Q. Besides this she was absolutely absent minded. Now she takes part in vocational activities such as household activities, Kantha Stitching, helping in cooking etc. she does this successfully through vocational training. Kantha stitching may be regarded as her source of income. She may be rehabilitate on the basis of her above experience in future with the cooperation of Government.

Other 10 (ten) beneficiaries are under vocational training. They cooperate in daily household activities. Besides these they take part in other vocational activities as for example, phenyl making, gardening etc. They will be expert in these trades within a short period. They may be rehabilitate on the basis of her above experience in future.

The inmates of GHARAUNDA Scheme produce Marks, Phenyl, Kantha Stitching work during vocational activities. Thus we started a business of production sale of Marks, Phenyl, Kantha Stitching works experimentally in the COVID-19 period.

Types of Services:

- 1) Assessment
- 2) Routine check-up
- 3) Vocational training
- 4) Parents orientation program
- 5) Permanent care service.

**RAMPURHAT CNCP(CWSN) BOYS' HOME:
CHILDREN IN NEEDS CARE AND PROTECTION:
(CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS): CNCP (CWSN):**

The Rampurhat CNCP(CWSN) Boys' Home was initiated on 1st April, 2018 and since that time the above mentioned Home has been running under the Rampurhat Spastics & Handicapped Society. In the same year on 1st August, 2018 the Rampurhat CNCP(CWSN)BOYS' HOME was sponsored by the Central Govt. of India and State Government of West Bengal. Though the total accommodation capacity of the Home is for 50 beneficiaries (Age limit: 6 to 18 yrs) at present we are working with 41 inmates.

Child Protection Means:

'Child Protection' is about protecting children from or against any perceived or real danger or risk to their life, their personhood and childhood. It is about reducing their vulnerability to any kind of harm and ensuring that no child falls out of the social safety net. While protection is a right of every child, some children are more vulnerable than others and need special attention. The govt. recognizes these children as 'children in different circumstances' characterized by their specific social, economic and geo-political situation.

➤ **Objectives of Rampurhat CNCP(CWSN) Boys' Home:**

The main objectives of the Rampurhat CNCP(CWSN) Boys' Home are providing institutionalize essential services and strengthen structures for emergency outreach, institutional care, family and community based care, counseling and support. Besides this, our home strengthen child protection at family and community level, create and promote preventive measures to protect children from situations of vulnerable measures to protect children from situation of vulnerability, risk and abuse.

➤ **Service Provided:**

There are 21 types of differently able are mentioned in the RPWD Act 2016. But at present we provided services to the five types of beneficiaries, such as i) Cerebral palsy ii) Mental Retardation iii) Multiple disability iv) Hearing impairment v) Autism.

We provide the following services for the betterment of the CWSN inmates. The services are:

- **Assessment:** First of all we have to determine the physical and mental age of a differently abled child on the basis of the degree of disability such as mild, moderate, severe and profound. We have to absorbed child in their style of laying position, sitting position, standing position. Then we assess the child and provide physical management such as physiotherapy, physical exercise and Yoga. According to the degree of disability such as mild, moderate, severe and profound they should be provided appropriate programs. On the other hand we have to study also the mental ability of the differently abled child such as whether he is able to recognize different objects, pictures etc. Then we specify the method to give him special education. An Assessment in special education is the process used to determine a child's specific learning strengths, needs and to determine whether or not a child is eligible for special education services. Assessment is primarily a problem-solving process. After assessment, special education is given to the children according to their age and abilities. The groups are i) Care group, ii) Pre-primary, iii) Primary I, iv) Primary II, v) Secondary, vi) Pre-vocational I, vii) Pre-vocational II.

- **Practice Daily Living Activity:** Most of the inmates of The Rampurhat CNCP (CWSN) Boys' Home are under Care Group. This group includes children with very low ability so they can not performed

their daily living activities, the basic skills such as drinking, feeding, toileting, bedding etc. The employees help the beneficiaries to do their daily living activities with sincerities.

- **Medical Support:** The Therapist comes in the Home weekly basis and provided therapy according to their needs. Medical Services are provided to the beneficiaries by a MBBS Doctor of Rampurhat Medical College & Hospital at least a day in a week. Beside this all staffs are follow the instruction of doctors for the betterment of the inmates.

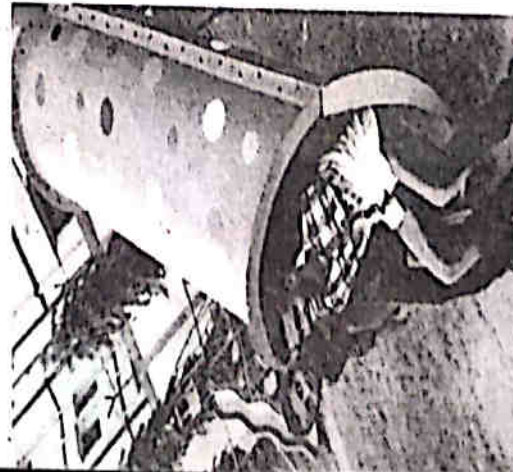
- **Maintaining proper Diet:** Though the all inmates are CWSN so we have to take special care towards their eating habit. We are provided food according to their diet list.

- **Special Education:** We have one professional special educator who provides special education to the CWSN inmates regularly. We keep attention to the beneficiaries on physical management, behavioral management & trying to achieve their cognitive development and personal, social activities for the children with mental retardation and multiple disabilities. We also try to integrate sense organs by providing stimulation of music, light and touch through playing and dancing etc. Teaching disabled students is a complicated task because of their various problems and difficulties that is a challenge to the teachers. Persons with disabilities are generally benefited from careful approaches of special teachers by way of precious teaching and direct instruction.



- **Pre-vocational Training:** Pre-vocational training is provided to the CWSN inmates for their skills development. First of all the inmates should be given idea about good, bad, colours, digit, addition, abstraction and reorganization of objects such as long, short, small, big, Straight line, Triangle, Square, Circle etc. Then the inmates perform different types of handicrafts according to their capacity. Such as diary making, file making, kantha stitch, tailoring, hair cutting, flameless cooking, gardening etc that will facilitate the process of rehabilitation in future as well as helps skills development of the inmates and build up their personality. Though they are CWSN child, they can prepare this item in partly basis by the help of the vocational trainer.

- **Child Friendly Environment:** We provide child friendly environment to the inmates. A child friendly environment should enable a safe space, which would ensure the Right to child's Recreation, protection and Participation.

- Besides the above we provide the following services also such as we enrolled the name of the beneficiaries in formal school, open individual bank account etc.

➤ Recreation :

The inmates of our Home take part in indoor games and outdoor games regularly. Besides this the inmates participates in picnic once a year. The inmates are celebrating their birth days in CCI. It was not possible to go out for a picnic in this COVID-19 situation so the inmates had a picnic in the ground of Home. In addition, children spend their leisure time watching TV and practicing yoga, leasing music etc.



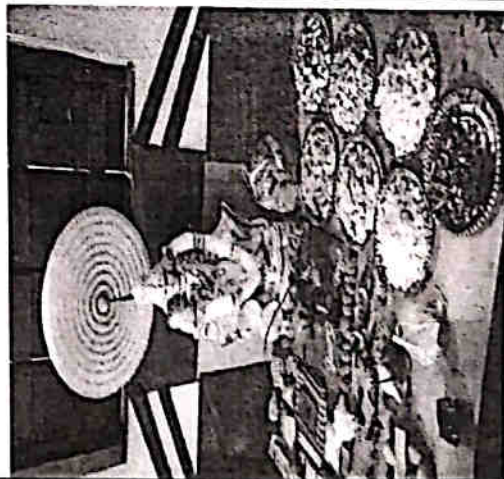
- **Activity report of Rampurhat CNCP(CWSN)BOYS' HOME:** This COVID-19 pandemic situation seemed to paralyze normal life. The inmates could not go to school, they could not go to play in the park. As a result, they were becoming very indifferent. That is why Rampurhat CNCP(CWSN)BOYS' HOME understood emotional needs of children and shot the following creative activities.

- **Awareness of COVID-19:** Children with disabilities have stronger reactions to ongoing pandemic. They have more intense distress, worry or anger that's why we started to make the child aware about this pandemic. We provide poster for awareness building activities and present some drama for ease of understanding. At the same time, the use of mask, sanitizer, handwash etc. was being trained repeatedly.

- **Counselling:** Counselling is a Psychological part of medical science, which is very helpful for children. Guidance and counselling are the process which helps the child to know their skills, interests so they can utilize their time. We provide regular counseling to children to protect them from mental illness.

- **Creative printable with inmates:** In this situation, some drawing competitions were often held with the children to keep them active. Through this activity the children were able to express themselves and to cut their distresses.

- **Special Day celebration:** While it is very difficult to celebrate all the special days like every year in this COVID-19 situation, yet some special

days were celebrated to entertain the children while maintaining social distance. Such as:

- **New year's Day:** We started the new year with the special children through a small event organized by Rampurhat CNCP(CWSN)BOYS' Home. In this new year, all special inmates were given new clothes. This day was celebrated by the special children through dance, song, drawing, sports and so

on.

- **Saraswati Puja:** All the CNCP staff and inmates of the Home gathered at the puja Mondap to celebrate Saraswati Puja. The puja mainly organized for special kids. They prayed in front of the idol in early morning. After the puja being over, they went to dissolve the idol on the next day. They were delighted with this whole effort.

- **Republic Day:** On the auspicious morning of 26th January 2020, our Home was celebrated Republic Day in the Home premises. It is a matter of great pride for all of us. On this occasion Rampurhat S.D.O Sir sent tiffin for the children. It was a great gesture from him.

➤ Work with the Department:

We work with the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), Juvenile Justice Board (JJB), Child Welfare Committee (C.W.C), Police Station, Hospital, Post Office, Electric Office, Municipality etc. They cooperate with us friendly.

Birbhum CHILDLINE, Rampurhat Sub- Centre
 CHILDLINE is India's first national level response to its ratification of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. The CHILDLINE 1098 service also receives a special mention in the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015. Supported by Ministry for Women and Child Development.

Introduction of Rampurhat CHILDLINE:

CHILDLINE India Foundation has started its journey on 26th March '2013 with other two Sub-Centres at Rampurhat and Suri. The Sub-Centers, Rampurhat Spastic and Handicapped Society of Rampurhat have been dedicated for 24x7 hours service with objective of CHILDLINE India initiative.

Rampurhat CHILD LINE reaches out to the most marginalized children with the aim of providing them rehabilitation and care from unsafe situations. CHILD LINE provides relief and rehabilitation in the space of shelter, medical aid, repatriation, rescue, emotional support and guidance etc.

The objectives of CHILDLINE services:

- i) Service provide on Covid-19 Period
- ii) To reach out to every child in need of care and protection by responding to emergencies on 1098 and by physically reaching out to children.
- iii) To adapt and integrate telecommunication technology, linking all districts to the service of 1098, and making it available to all children in need of care and protection.
- iv) To provide a platform of networking amongst organizations and to provide linkages to support systems that facilitates the rehabilitation of children in need of care and protection.
- v) To work together with the Allied Systems (Police, Health Care, Juvenile Justice, Transport, Legal, Education, Communication, Media, Political and the Community) to create child friendly systems.

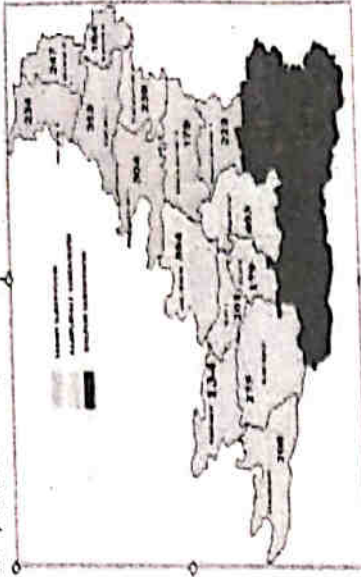
- vi) To advocate for services for children that are inaccessible, non-existent or inadequate.
- vii) To create a body of NGOs and Government organizations working within the national framework and policy for children.
- viii) To be a nodal child protection agency in the country, providing child protection services to children in need of care and protection.
- ix) To set up innovative child protection services leveraging technological advancements in areas where such services are inaccessible, non-existent or inadequate.
- x) To undertake research with the objectives of strengthening the CHILDLINE 1098 service, and studying new and emerging trends in child protection issue.
- xi) To contribute and work towards strengthening and participating in a global movement that addresses issues related to child protection and ensures that children's voices are heard.

CHILD LINE SERVICE:

The main concern of Rampurhat child line is to create a child – friendly environment that guarantees the rights and protection of all children. The most important services of Child Line as follows:

i) CHILDLINE Birbhum (Rampurhat Sub-centre) 1098 Service CHILDLINE Activity during the Lock down for COVID-19: Around the world, when the Covid-19 epidemic and the Lockdown situation was terrible, when the people could not get out, at that time CHILDLINE (Rampurhat Sub-centre) was active for 24x7- hour to make people aware of Covid-19 and continues to help children in a variety of ways.

In this situation CHILDLINE (Rampurhat Sub centre) distributed Rice, Pulses, Potatoes, Medicine, Mask to Twenty (20) children and we also distributed Clothes, Baby food, Rice, Pulses, Potatoes, Mask, and Medicine to other five (5) children in the Rampurhat sub-centre area. We put those distressed families in touch with the local B.D.O office, So that those children do not have any problem in this covid-19 situation.

ii) **Phone call service:** CHILDLINE is a national, 24x7, free phone emergency outreach service for children in need of care and protection, linking them to long term rehabilitation. Any child or concerned adult can call 1098 to access the CHILD LINE service any time of the day or night.

iii) **Outreach and Awareness programs:** CHILDLINE song, puppet shows, Street plays, Open House sessions, Children's events/happenings, children's groups' presentations etc event done by this program in front of 50 children. Expected to happen as a result of the performance at least 3 case reports for every 50 children.

iv) **Open House program:** Open House is an open forum for children associated with CHILDLINE to address conflicts, assess, and review and evaluate the service. It allows space for the Child Line team along with the children to identify solutions to problems. Open House is held once in a month and the venue needs to be accessible to children. Games and food can be part of this program. It helps breaking the ice, makes the children more comfortable.

v) **Prohibition of Child marriage:** The trend of child marriage is a bit higher at Rampurhat and its adjoining areas. Rampurhat Child Line usually tries to make people aware of these areas through awareness programs. Rampurhat Child Line prevents 59 cases of child marriage on the year of 2020-21.

vi) **Fight against child labour and child abuse:** Child labour refers to the exploitation of children through any form of work that deprives children of their childhood interferes with their ability to attend regular school and is mentally, physically, socially or morally harmful. Rampurhat Child Line fight against child labour and prevent 82 cases on the year of 2020-21. Child abuse or child maltreatment is physical, sexual, psychological maltreatment or neglect of a child or children. Rampurhat Child Line helps protect children from child abuse.

vii) **Protection of child rights:** Child Line works for the protection of the rights of all children in general. But its special focus is on all children in need of care and protection, specially the more vulnerable sections, which include: street children and youth living along on the streets.
